## Additional Announcements

**Students that want to attend high school and middle school athletic events should** purchase an All-Season Athletic Pass for \$50 on the Bath Athletics Website under Ticket Box Office. If you have any questions stop by the Athletic Office.

**After School Pick-up:** The gate between the Football Field and the MS will be closed after school. HS students may still be picked up in the West Parking Lot (between HS and MS) or South Parking Lot (Gym/Softball Field) All traffic for picking up MS students will be re-routed to use the Elementary School entrance (West side of Tennis Courts) and drive around the Soccer Field to the designated pick-up area between the MS and Soccer Field. Vehicles will be restricted from entering the driveway between the MS and Soccer Field immediately after school. HS students may park in the lot between the MS and Den or in the ES bus lot. Students can also walk to the Den after school even though the gate will be closed.

Students,

You are **REQUIRED** to report to your Wildcat Time each day that you are choosing to attend a club meeting. It is imperative that you check in with your teacher and then report to the meeting. Students that continue to fail in adhering to this request will be restricted from attending club meetings.
