# Free Application for Federal Student Aid www.fafsa.gov

- Create an account to apply. <u>FAFSA Worksheet</u> is helpful!
- IRS Data Retrieval Tool to transfer financial information for eligible applicants (tax info)
- As early as October, as late as June...First come, First served
- FAFSA's website includes section on <u>Aid for Military Families</u>
- Step 1 in paying for college!
  - i.e. federal grants, work-study programs, loans

# Helpful Tidbits

- Searching for scholarships= a full-time job!
  - reading through all eligibility requirements
  - filling out lengthy applications & writing essays
  - obtaining recommendations
- Never pay for scholarship searches!
- Scholarships → need-based or merit-based
- Scholarships may also involve other factors: choice of major; gender; religion; talents; race; disability; parental affiliations (employment, organizations); student affiliations (clubs, hobbies, employment).

# Helpful Tidbits

- Volunteer/community service is almost always an eligibility requirement.
- Dropping/failing courses can adversely affect your chances of getting a scholarship.
- Leadership and experiential programs can greatly benefit.
- Scholarships are <u>VERY</u> competitive!

### Do's and Don't 's

- Don't miss your deadline!
- **Do** read & follow directions carefully.
- Do check your grammar!
- **Do** have a general essay prepared in advance that highlights you—and you can enhance for various scholarship essays.
- **Do** let your essay be a true reflection of you, not what you think they want to hear.

### Do's and Don't 's

- **Don't** be overly confident or arrogant in your essay—humility goes a long way.
- **Do** have a teacher review the essay or a parent/counselor review the application to make sure that nothing is missed. Also, use <a href="www.tutor.com/military">www.tutor.com/military</a> for essay review!
- **Don't** ask teachers/counselors for recommendations at the last minute!
- **Do** have a student résumé to give to your recommender.
