The high school leadership class organized activities for the fourth grade students. The high school students were practicing their leadership skills while the fourth graders learned the importance of teamwork.












Campout in the Classroom

Putnam County Health Department and Putnam County Schools Joint Agreement:

In an effort to keep students in school and continue participation in extracurricular activities, and following information that shows that masking has reduced the spread of COVID-19 among students, the Ohio Department of Health has issued modified guarantine guidelines, thus giving parents a choice in the quarantine of their child. The Putnam County Health Department and Putnam County Schools will adopt these modified quarantine guidelines and will follow the protocols listed below for K-12 close contact students.

School Attendance

For students who are named as school contacts to a COVID-19 positive individual these are the following options and/or circumstances:

- 1. The student may attend school during the entirety of the 14-day quarantine if he/she wears a mask correctly and consistently.
- 2. The student may choose to guarantine at home as outlined previously:
 - a. Quarantine at home for 10 days since last contact and then return to school on days 11 through 14 wearing a mask.
 - b. Quarantine student at home, have student tested for COVID-19 on day 5-7 of quarantine. If negative, the student may return to school on day 8.

Extra-curricular Activities

For students who are named as school contacts to a COVID-19 positive individual these are the following options and/or circumstances:

- 1. If a student is involved in extracurricular activities, he or she may continue to participate provided he or she tests negative for COVID-19 immediately following notification of exposure. Masking is encouraged on days 0-7 as feasible or as much as possible
- 2. Have student tested for COVID-19 a second time on day 5-7. If negative, the student may continue extracurricular activities. Masking is encouraged on days 8-14 as feasible or as much as possible
- 3. If the student is not tested, he or she may resume extracurricular activities after day 10. Masking is encouraged on days 11-14 as feasible or as much as possible.

Please Note: The tests referenced above are SARS-CoV-2 viral (PCR or antigen) tests. They should be proctored/observed by someone and cannot be an over the counter, at home test that was self-administered without a proctor.

*If the student named as a contact has been vaccinated or wore a mask during their contact with the positive student, the student will not have to quarantine or miss extracurricular activities, but according to CDC guidelines must wear a mask and monitor for symptoms.
