

#### What is College Credit Plus

Basically, a high school student can earn college credit while in high school at no cost to him/her or their family. The student can do this by attending the university exclusively, staying at the high school with a college professor, or stay at high school and be taught by a high school teacher who is an adjunct professor.

Ottoville offers 50 plus credits for students. Obviously, not all students can take all the credits Ordered due to schedules and time. Ottoville students upon graduation leave with 27-32 credits as they enter college. We have to monitor this because if they leave with too many credits then they may not be eligible for scholarships offered to incoming freshmen as they may have sophomore status with their credits.

The cost per credit differs depending on the University. Ottoville deals with Rhodes State and Ohio Northem University. They charge anywhere from \$40/credit hour to \$166.55/credit hour. Who picks up this cost? The Local School district does. In the last 4 years Ottoville Local Schools has paid out \$127,813.00 for college credit for our students.

Last years senior class left with 618 college credits which would have cost them \$111,858 if they would have attended Rhodes State or \$505,524 if they had attended The University of Findlay.
