HORSTMAN ACHIEVES TOP ACT SCORE



Ben Horstman, a junior at Ottoville High School and the son of Kevin and Beth Horstman earned the highest possible ACT composite score of 36.

Only around two-tenths of 1 percent of students who take the ACT earn a top score. In a recent study of the graduating class of 2018, only 3,741 out of more than 1.9 million graduates who took the ACT earned a top composite score of 36 across the United States.

The ACT consists of tests in English, mathematics, reading and science, each scored on a scale of 1–36. A student's composite score is the average of the four test scores. The score for ACT's optional writing test is reported separately and is not included within the ACT composite score.

In a letter to Ben recognizing this exceptional achievement, ACT CEO Marten Roorda stated, "Your achievement on the ACT is significant and rare. Your exceptional scores will provide any college or university with ample evidence of your readiness for the academic rigors that lie ahead."

The ACT is a curriculum-based exam that measures what students have learned in school. Students who earn a 36 composite score have likely mastered all of the skills and knowledge they will need to succeed in first-year college courses in the core subject areas.

Congratulations to Ben and his family on this outstanding achievement. Your dedication to working hard in many avenues of your life is evident in this accomplishment. Ottoville is very proud to have you as a part of our school community!
