NATIONAL MERIT SCHOLARSHIP FINALIST

Not only has Ben Horstman received the honor of being Homecoming King of 2021, he has also recently been recognized as a Finalist in the 2021 National Merit Scholarship Program. The steps to becoming a Finalist started in 2019 when over 1.5 million juniors in about 21,000 high schools entered the program by taking the PSAT. The nationwide pool of Semifinalists, representing less than one percent of U.S. high school seniors, included the highest-scoring entrants in each state.

As a Semifinalist, Ben had to advance to the Finalist level of the competition by meeting additional standards and fulfilling several requirements. These included having a record of very high academic performance throughout high school, submitting an ACT score that confirmed his PSAT performance, and being fully endorsed and recommended by a high school official. Ben also provided information about his school and community activities, leadership abilities, employment, and honors and awards received.

As a finalist, Ben will compete this spring for the National Merit \$2500 Scholarship, as well as corporate and college-sponsored Merit Scholarship awards.
