








Fewer students in larger spaces

THE DISTRICT WILL SAVE AN ESTIMATED 700K ANNUALLY BY THE CONSOLIDATION OF THE TWO 65-YEAR-OLD EXISTING MIDDLE SCHOOLS INTO ONE STATE-OF-THE-ART NEW MIDDLE SCHOOL THROUGH THE DECREASING COSTS OF PERSONNEL, MAINTENANCE, GROUNDS, FOOD SERVICE, JANITORIAL SERVICE, UTILITIES AND INSURANCE.


EVERY YEAR, THE DISTRICT LOSES AN AVERAGE OF 30 EMPLOYEES BECAUSE OF RETIREMENT, MOVING, OR JOB CHANGES.

IT'S CALLED ATTRITION

DISTRICT THREE EXPECTS TO LOSE AT LEAST 11 EMPLOYEES FROM THE MIDDLE SCHOOLS EVEN BEFORE A NEW SCHOOL COULD OPEN.


IT WILL ALSO BE LESS EXPENSIVE TO OPERATE ONE MIDDLE SCHOOL CAMPUS INSTEAD OF TWO SEPARATE CAMPUSES.

100% OF THE \$700,000 SAVINGS WILL BE USED TO IMPROVE OUR OVERALL INSTRUCTIONAL PROGRAM BY ADDING ADDITIONAL HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT COURSES AT THE MIDDLE SCHOOL FOR: CATE, COMPUTER SCIENCE, MATH AND ELA, PROVIDING ADDITIONAL ELECTIVES AND CREATING ADDITIONAL CLASSES FOR OUR AT-RISK EARLY CHILDHOOD STUDENTS.






















AFTER: New Grade Level and Activity Specific Furniture










Preliminary Concept New Middle School First Floor Plan



- SEEK APPROVAL FOR BOND REFERENDUM






Spartanburg Area Chamber of Commerce/Spartanburg Economic Futures Group
