PROCESS ON MAY 15TH:

- Students enter the east parking lot by the fire house at the designated time
- Administrator checks off that the senior student brought ALL DROP OFF ITEMS (Chromebooks, textbooks, library books, fees, etc.) These needed items will be communicated to students prior to the 15th
 - o If NO, senior student returns home to gather items and returns at 1:00 pm (make up time)
 - o If YES, senior student proceeds to north parking lot
- Student will exit their vehicle and place items into appropriate bins
- Staff will check off items placed into bins on a "Drop off Form" for tracking purposes
- After all drop off items are collected, staff will radio the pick up zone for the student
- Student will drive on the path between the baseball field and gym
- Student will exit the car by the Ag Shop doors and be directed to the "Pick Up Table"
- Student will gather their cap/gown/diploma/cords/awards/etc.
- Student will exit the west lot onto Brown Street
