**II. Any letter requesting to speak to the Board placed on the agenda must list the item of discussion and/or purpose of the presentation before placement shall be granted.

- B. The Public Participation section shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of regular business of the Board unless agreed by the majority of the Board members present to extend that period of time.

Anyone who wishes to express concerns regarding an item on the current meeting's agenda shall complete a registration card and present it to the Board President prior to the start of the meeting. The President will then announce the items and those persons to speak during the Public Participation segment preceding the start of regular business.
