Just Harvest works to change the unjust public policies that create poverty and hunger. Our services are aimed at helping struggling individuals and families access the safety net benefits they are eligible for and that can make a critical difference in their lives.



The Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) is the nation's largest antipoverty program and can increase a family's annual income by as much as 45%. Unfortunately, many people lose much of their refunds to commercial tax preparers in preparation fees and advance refund loans.

From January to April each year, Just Harvest provides certified, free tax preparation assistance. We have day, evening, and Saturday hours to accommodate the busy schedules of working families.

You can schedule an appointment starting the second week of January by dialing 2-1-1.



The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (or "food stamps") is our nation's first line of defense against hunger. It is a public benefit that you can use to supplement your food budget to provide you and your family with nutritious food.

SNAP is a federal government program administered in Pennsylvania by the state's Department of Human Services (DHS). **Just Harvest helps hundreds of families apply for these benefits each year.** Major support for Just Harvest's SNAP application assistance program is provided by the PA DHS.
