Important Information

The Avonworth School District's Board-approved Health & Safety Plan remains in place, which requires masks for all students, staff, and visitors in our school buildings. This requirement applies during the school day as well as when in our school buildings for activities after school hours. Thank you for your cooperation.

Blue = Low Transmission Level
Yellow = Moderate Transmission Level
Orange = Substantial Transmission Level
Red = High Transmission Level

NOTE: Per the CDC - The transmission level is determined by the *Cases Per 100K* and *the Percent Positivity Rate* falling in a level. <u>If the two indicators suggest different levels, the transmission level corresponds to the higher threshold.</u>

Based on current data, Allegheny County is currently at the **High Transmission Level Quarantine Guidance & Information:**

<u>CDC Close Contact Definition</u>: A close contact is considered someone who was within 6 feet of an infected person (laboratory-confirmed) for 15 minutes or more within 2 days prior to illness onset.

Exceptions:

- In the K-12 indoor setting, the close contact definition <u>excludes</u> students who were not less than 3 feet of an infected student if universal masking is in place and all students were wearing masks.
- An individual that is fully vaccinated and asymptomatic **does not** need to quarantine.
- An individual who was previously diagnosed with COVID-19 within the last three months
 of being identified as a close contact <u>does not</u> need to quarantine.

The Allegheny County Health Department has provided the following Quarantine Flowchart to assist K-12 schools in making quarantine decisions.

Reporting Health Information & Collective Community Effort:

Please contact your child's school nurse if your child is identified to be positive for COVID-19. To limit the transmission of COVID-19 in our schools and school community, it is critical that this information is shared and proper contact tracing is completed.

We would like to remind our parents/guardians to continue to be diligent with regard to monitoring your child(ren)'s health. Daily health monitoring and keeping children home when needed are necessary to limit virus transmission.

If a student has any of the following symptoms, please keep them home:

- Has shown any of the following symptoms:
 - Fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, repeated shaking with chills, achiness, sore throat, and new loss of taste or smell
- Active vomiting or diarrhea
- Fever (100 degrees or higher), chills, or general body aches
