Senior Scheduling Reminders:

- Every effort will be made to ensure that students are properly placed in the classes that they request during the registration process. However, if there are conflicts in class periods priority will go to core courses and courses required for graduation.
- Students and parents must give serious consideration now when selecting courses. **Schedules are not changed unless one of the following criterion have occurred:**
 - Lack of a required course or failure to meet a prerequisite
 - Course completion in summer school
 - Procedural error
 - Registering for an equivalent CCP course
- All students need to be aware of their graduation requirements including 20 credits and testing requirements.
- Students can only have **one yearlong study hall**.
- All students must be passing the equivalent of five courses for eligibility and full-time student status. (PE does not count towards eligibility)
- If students plan to enroll in CCP, CBI, CAT, or BDA courses all paperwork and approval must be completed by the student and parent on or before necessary deadlines. Please list these intentions below in the “Notes to Counselor” box below.
