<u>Notes from Principal Vens</u>

Sylvania Schools monitors student activity online

for the purpose of protecting students, both emotionally and physically. Two companies are used for detection--*Go Guardian* and *Bark*--and you may hear us refer to one or both if something your student does online is flagged.

In addition to enabling teachers to see what tabs students have open during class, the software also scans for keywords (including abbreviations and other modifications) in student emails, documents, and searches. **This is done during and after school hours**. The system is designed to flag things that relate to drugs, sex, bullying, school violence, and self-harm.

While our protocol has always been to call a parent or guardian when we receive an alert, in most cases we will now be calling <u>and</u> sending an email with the words or phrases that were flagged. In fact, some of the people reading this may have already received a phone call and/or email related to one of these *Bark* or *Go Guardian* alerts.

Mr. Joplin has addressed this with students in every lunch period on multiple occasions to make sure they are aware of the monitoring system and how it is used.





Dear Sylvania Families,

We hope this message finds you well. We are writing to inform you about an important change regarding the state-funded ACT assessment for students in the Class of 2026. Beginning in Spring 2025, parents or guardians can exercise the option for their student <u>not</u> to take the state-funded ACT, in accordance with state law.

While the District is still required to administer the ACT to all grade 11 students, and this is a wonderful opportunity for those students who may benefit from this test, we recognize that not all students' future career plans may rely upon ACT results. We also recognize that students may have already participated in ACT testing and achieved desired scores. To this end, this new provision allows you to make decisions that best suit your child's educational path and needs. If you choose to exercise this option, please complete the form below and return it to the Counseling Office by December 20, 2024.

Please note that any junior student who opts out of the state-funded ACT on February 25, 2025 must participate in one of the CommUnity activities listed in building communication.






