STUDENT-ATHLETE LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Here's a recap of our most recent **Student-Athlete Leadership Training (SALT)** session held on February 28th. This session focused on the concept of Values and how they shape leadership.

Session Overview

- **Defining Values:** Students explored what values means to them and how they serve as a personal compass for decision-making and leadership. The instructors compiled a list of values that were shared by the students.
- Scenario Discussions: Students were given three real-world situations and had to choose between two possible values from the list to make a decision. They then explained their choices.

Scenarios & Value Choices:

- 1. A discouraged teammate before a big game Trust or Relationships
- A teammate not wanting to attend an early morning practice –
 Accountability or Consistency
- 3. Student section at a rival school chanting inappropriate things Respect or Integrity
- Reflection & Takeaway: The session concluded with students reflecting on how they can apply their values in sports and life. The key message was:

Values guide us in the choices we make, both on and off the field. They are our compass in leadership and decision-making.


