

- **Have a plan for testing.** Plan your test-taking timeline.
- **Note extracurricular involvement.** Take an inventory of all your clubs, summer activities and/or part-time jobs.

Scheduling Considerations: Parent Overrides

We are at the time of year where many decisions are being made that impact next school year, and maybe the progression toward future goals. Course selections are a critical piece in setting students up for success.

Our staff takes the time to reflect on different skills and characteristics before recommending placement. We still understand that parents and students want to challenge themselves or have preferences regarding academic rigor; therefore, there is an override process in place.

In order to make this more meaningful, we will be refining the process so that decisions are made in a team-based approach to reflect a comprehensive understanding of the student.

The process will result in a phone conference with families where we will share details regarding:

- Current academic performance and demonstrated ability
- Future course expectations and level of rigor
- Work habits, readiness, and motivation
- Possible unintended consequences, both academic and social-emotional

Please note that because each request is reviewed thoroughly, response timelines may be extended to work through this with care and fidelity.

Override requests will not be considered beyond the end of the school year. Summer months are important for the completion of course requirements and may directly impact the student's grade for the start of a new year.

Our goal is to make informed, thoughtful, and student-centered decisions in a supportive environment. Thank you for your partnership and patience through this process.

EID al-Adha

Sylvania Schools recognizes that Muslim holidays follow a lunar calendar and may vary slightly based on moon sighting. The dates below reflect anticipated 2026 observances that the district will consider excused, with documentation submitted in advance.

Sylvania Schools recognizes and respects religious observances. Due to Eid al-Adha falling on scheduled exam days, we need to know who will need arrangements made to take exams before the holiday.

Parent/guardian(s) may submit a form to request an excused absence for a student observing Muslim religious holidays this spring. Forms are available in the main office and must be completed and turned into the main office by March 20, 2026.

The prize is typically a **\$500 scholarship**, and anyone can apply. (The award is not limited to seniors.) Applications can be found in the main office and guidance office. **The deadline is April 3rd.**
