## What is the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile?

The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile is just that. A mobile medical clinic designed with children in mind, incorporating patient exam rooms, a waiting area and a laboratory area.

The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile is staffed with medical professionals from ProMedica Russell J. Ebeid Children's Hospital. The team may include a physician assistant, nurse practitioner, medical assistant and a driver.

The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile was made possible by a generous grant from Ronald McDonald House Charities Global to deliver on Ronald McDonald House Charities of Northwest Ohio's mission of providing access to quality healthcare for children in our community.

## What services are provided to patients?

- School and sports physicals.
- Immunizations.
- Oral hygiene education.
- Asthma self-management education.
- Vision and hearing screening.
- Nutrition counseling.
- Childhood health promotion and injury prevention education.
- Mental health assessment and referral.
- Social service resource referral.
- Health education.


## Who is served by the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile?

The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile program gives children and their families access to a wide range of services and educational tools with the goal of connecting the child and family to a medical home. The target demographic is ages $0-6$ years old, but we will not turn any child away under 18 years of age.

While this program is not meant to replace regular visits to a doctor, it does provide an entry point into a regular pattern of health care for children. All individuals will be given multiple providers that they can choose from in the community.

## Items to bring:

- Insurance card.
- Identification.
- Primary care provider information.

How are health care services by The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile paid for?
We will bill insurance just like a routine visit to a provider's office or clinic. We will treat any patient regardless of their insurance status or ability to pay and will follow ProMedica Toledo Hospital's standard billing processes. We can also connect uninsured patients to resources to help them enroll in Medicaid or other insurance programs.

## More information:

- We will be at your location from 9 am until 1 pm , taking the last patient at $12: 30 \mathrm{pm}$.
- The visit will take about 40 minutes from start to finish.
- We will help connect you to other services to continue a healthy future.
