



# **Notes from Principal Vens**

We get requests from parents every semester about changing their child's exam schedule. The questions are typically about taking exams during different periods to free up a day, or even missing all of the exam days for a trip. These are considered Personal Convenience Absences (PCA), which are NOT granted in the final two weeks of the grading period, including exam week.

To be clear, teachers are not obligated to administer exams during different periods or on different days to accommodate family travel plans or other conflicts. In fact, teachers will enter a grade of "Did Not Attempt" (DNA) into PowerSchool if the student fails to test. This policy is significant because a DNA is recorded as a 0% for the exam grade, which will undoubtedly have a large, negative effect on the final GPA.

We encourage everyone to check the current academic calendar for all of this year's exam dates, as well as reference the calendar for 2026-2027 for future planning purposes. The district aims to publish the academic calendar at least one year in advance, so conflicts can be avoided.

There has been an important update to our **Honor Roll calculation policy** that takes effect this school year.

Students in Honor Roll will be awarded based on their

Grade 9: Semester GPA

Students in Honor Roll will continue to be evaluated on their

Grades 10-12: Quarter GPA

This change is being implemented for the following reasons:

- Accuracy and Consistency
- Weighted Course Equity
- Alignment with Transcripts

The thresholds for earning Honor Roll will remain the same. Students must be enrolled in four high school courses to earn honor roll. Any student who has a grade below a "C" will be eliminated from the highest honor roll categories.

Honor Roll awards will be given to 10-12 grade students during homeroom on November 13, 2026. 9th grade students will receive honor roll in January at the close of first semester.

# District Safety and Security



#### **HIGH SCHOOL INTRA-DISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT** 2026-2027

All students enrolled in the Sylvania School District are assigned to the school serving their attendance area. Students enrolled in grades 9-12 may request open enrollment as set forth below, per policy 5113.01.

#### **Procedure**

Application forms will be available upon request through the Student Support Services Department. You must come to the Office of Student Support Services during office hours to submit an application. Office hours are Monday through Friday 7:30 am - 4:00 pm, please make sure to bring your ID.

The application dates for intra-district open enrollment are as follows: The first school day in October through the third Monday in November. Students enrolling to Sylvania Schools may apply upon their registration process.

#### Criteria per Board Policy and Administrative Guidelines 5113.01

Intra-district open enrollment requests for assignment to Northview or Southview will be honored according to the following criteria:

Student enrollment to the requested school does not exceed the program capacity of each building, currently 1340 students for Northview and 1340 students for Southview.

Student enrollment to the requested school does not exceed the established open enrollment grade/cohort (335) capacity by grade level or special program capacity and size.

Students with attendance/tardy to school issues (fifteen (15) or more combined per school year) and/or disciplinary violations may have their open enrollment revoked/rejected per recommendation of the Director of Student Support Services.

Suspensions and expulsions will be reviewed regarding open enrolled students and may result in rejection/return to their residential District school.

#### **Notification**

Notifications will be <u>emailed (no phone calls please)</u> from Student Support Services to parent/guardian(s) (email provided on application), building administrators, and school counselors. Applications will be acted upon in the order received after the November deadline by the Director.

Parents will be notified on a rolling basis.

If approved, there will be <u>NO</u> transportation provided for your student.

Students accepted for open enrollment will remain in their approval school for the entire school year.

A new application must be submitted annually by the parent/guardian(s) if the student wishes to continue attending a school outside their residential attendance area.

Students in grades 10-12 who participate in sports, OHSAA guidelines will be followed.










# TRAVELING SAFELY THROUGH WORK ZONES Traveling safely, slowly, and attentively through work zon

Traveling safely, slowly, and attentively through work zones is critically important, particularly as a commercial motor vehicle (CMV) driver. Narrow lanes, sudden stops, traffic pattern shifts, and uneven road surfaces present unique challenges in these areas for large trucks and buses. In fact, large trucks are overrepresented in fatal work zone crashes.

Do your part to stay safe with tips from the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration's (FMCSA) Our Roads, Our Safety campaign:



Before setting out on the road, research your route. When possible, avoid work zones and use any detours that are available.

#### PAY ATTENTION

Be aware of all signs throughout work zones that can indicate reduced speeds, lane changes, and other important information. Avoid distractions such as your cellphone, eating, drinking, the radio, GPS, and conversing with other passengers.



### SLOW DOWN

Lane closures, traffic pattern shifts, and reduced speeds are common in work zones. Make sure to slow down when entering a work zone and keep an eye out for road workers.

#### MOVE INTO THE OPEN LANE

When approaching lane closures, move into the open lane as soon as possible. Be sure to pay close attention to vehicles around you that could be in your blind spot, and ensure you're not traveling in someone else's.

# RIGHT

#### KEEP YOUR DISTANCE

Rear-end crashes are extremely common in work zones. Always maintain extra space between your vehicle and the one in front of you.
