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## Notes from Principal Vens

Far too many students and parents see the first link for summer school and give up hope for fourth quarter. In most cases in which a student failed third quarter, however, fourth quarter grades can salvage credit for the semester. Considering that each semester of credit that requires summer intervention costs \$200, some hard work until the end of the year can really pay off.

Because of the 40-40-20 weighted average we use for calculating semester grades, a final semester grade can be determined using the following math...

Double your Q3 grade. Double your Q4 grade. Add them together with your exam grade. If the total is 300 or higher, and you didn't earn more than one F, you pass! Here is an example of how a student could fail 3rd quarter, but still pass for the semester...

Example grade calculation Q3 - 56% (F) x 2 = Q4 - 71% (C-) x 2 = Exam - 65% (D) =

**112 + 142 + 65 = 319**. This student passed the second semester of this class. They would <u>not</u> need to take summer school, even though they failed third quarter.

We hope students will keep this scenario in mind as the end of the year approaches, and it gets very easy to be lazy or to get distracted.

While this program is not meant to replace regular visits to a doctor, it does provide an entry point into a regular pattern of health care for children. All individuals will be given multiple providers that they can choose from in the community.

#### How are health care services by The Ronald McDonald Care Mobile paid for?


