## ATTENTION SENIORS

### Notice regarding your Google Account

We want to share important information regarding student Google accounts (Google Drive, Gmail, and other Google services provided by the district).

### Account Access Timeline

Student Google accounts will be **disabled shortly after graduation** and **permanently removed after a grace period of approximately 90 days**.

After this date, all files and data associated with the account—including documents, photos, videos, and emails—will be permanently deleted and cannot be recovered.

### What You Should Do Before Graduation

If you would like to keep any of your files, we strongly encourage you to take action before your account is removed.

Here are a few recommended options if you wish to retain your files:

### Download Your Files

- Log into your school Google account
- Use **Google Takeout** ([takeout.google.com](https://takeout.google.com)) to export all your data at once  
*or*
- Manually download important files from Google Drive to a personal device

### Important Notes

- Once accounts are deleted, **the district cannot recover any data**
- Files shared with others may become inaccessible if you were the owner

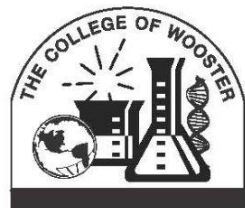

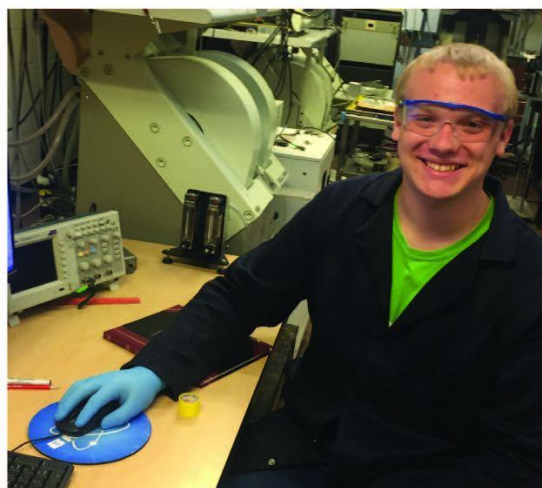
