Ohio's End of Course Exams

At this critical point of the school year, we are preparing to administer Ohio's End-of-Course exams. These exams play a significant role in students' academic achievements and are a vital component of graduation requirements. To review how the exams impact graduation, I would encourage you to review the more detailed information in the [Program of Studies](#).

Southview will follow a **two-hour delay** schedule to administer the tests on the following dates:


- April 8 and 9: ELA II (English 10)**
- April 15: American History and Government**
- April 16: Biology**
- April 22 and 23: Algebra I and Geometry**

Students who are scheduled to test are expected to arrive on time and report to their assigned location by 7:35; students will receive a personalized test schedule via email closer to the testing window. Please be attentive to all communication.

Transportation will be provided at normal route times; students who are not testing but need transportation will be assigned to a study hall.

Ohio State Testing - April 2026

There are **six (6) late starts** ([2 Hour Delay](#)) during the month of April.

The late start schedule will allow us to administer the required state tests (OST) with minimal class disruption. **On these 6 days, buses will run at normal times.** If you are **not** testing, and don't start school until 9:35 AM, it is your responsibility to **provide your own transportation OR ride the bus** as usual and remain in a study hall from 7:35-9:35 AM.

Wednesday, April 8 - ELA II (Part 1)

Thursday, April 9 - ELA II (Part 2)

Note: ELA II is typically for sophomore English students.

Wednesday, April 15 - American History/Government

Note: Government is for AP students only

Thursday, April 16 - Biology

Wednesday, April 22 - Algebra/Geometry (Part 1)

Thursday, April 23 - Algebra/Geometry (Part 2)

Students will receive an email from Assistant Principal Sarah Dickerson with confirmation of OST's they are taking, the date, and room assignments.

Our state testing schedule begins on Wednesday, April 8 and continues through the month of April.

Did you know that performance on the state tests can qualify you for an exam exemption?

Here's how it works:

- If students meet the **state test performance standards**, they may **substitute their second semester exam scores** with an equivalent percent for the exam grade. Students may opt out of taking the exam, or they may choose to take the better of the two scores for semester grade calculation.
- This exemption applies to the core subjects where state testing is available.(ELA II, Algebra, Geometry, American History, Government, Biology).
- The score must be reached on a first attempt.
- Students will receive an Opt Out form to indicate their preference for grade reporting prior to semester two exams

Scheduling Considerations: Parent Overrides

We are at the time of year where many decisions are being made that impact next school year, and maybe the progression toward future goals. Course selections are a critical piece in setting students up for success.

Our staff takes the time to reflect on different skills and characteristics before recommending placement. We still understand that parents and students want to challenge themselves or have preferences regarding academic rigor; therefore, there is an override process in place.

In order to make this more meaningful, we will be refining the process so that decisions are made in a team-based approach to reflect a comprehensive understanding of the student.

The process will result in a phone conference with families where we will share details regarding:

- Current academic performance and demonstrated ability
- Future course expectations and level of rigor
- Work habits, readiness, and motivation
- Possible unintended consequences, both academic and social-emotional

Please note that because each request is reviewed thoroughly, response timelines may be extended to work through this with care and fidelity.

Override requests will not be considered beyond the end of the school year. Summer months are important for the completion of course requirements and may directly impact the student's grade for the start of a new year.

Our goal is to make informed, thoughtful, and student-centered decisions in a supportive environment. Thank you for your partnership and patience through this process.

EID al-Adha
