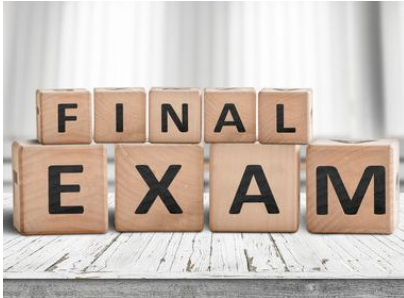

Notes from Principal Vens

The first semester exams are on Tuesday (12/16), Wednesday (12/17), and Thursday (12/18). For those three days, academic requirements end at 12:25 instead of the typical 2:25. In order for your child to leave at that time (or earlier), parents must provide permission in one of the following ways:

- Permission has been granted via OneView. (A list of student IDs without permission is on p. 3) -OR-
- Submit a signed "Golden Ticket" (p. 4) that the student presents when they leave the building.

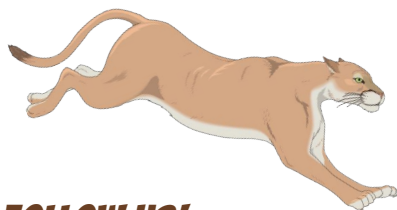
There will be a study hall from 12:25 to 2:25, and the buses run at the regular time. We will have some pizza available for purchase.

In order to be excused from an ungraded class, such as a study hall or a teacher aid period, please sign and return the exam attendance excusal form that the teacher shared with your child.

NOTE - The only excusal during a graded exam period is for a medical or court note. The exam will be rescheduled.

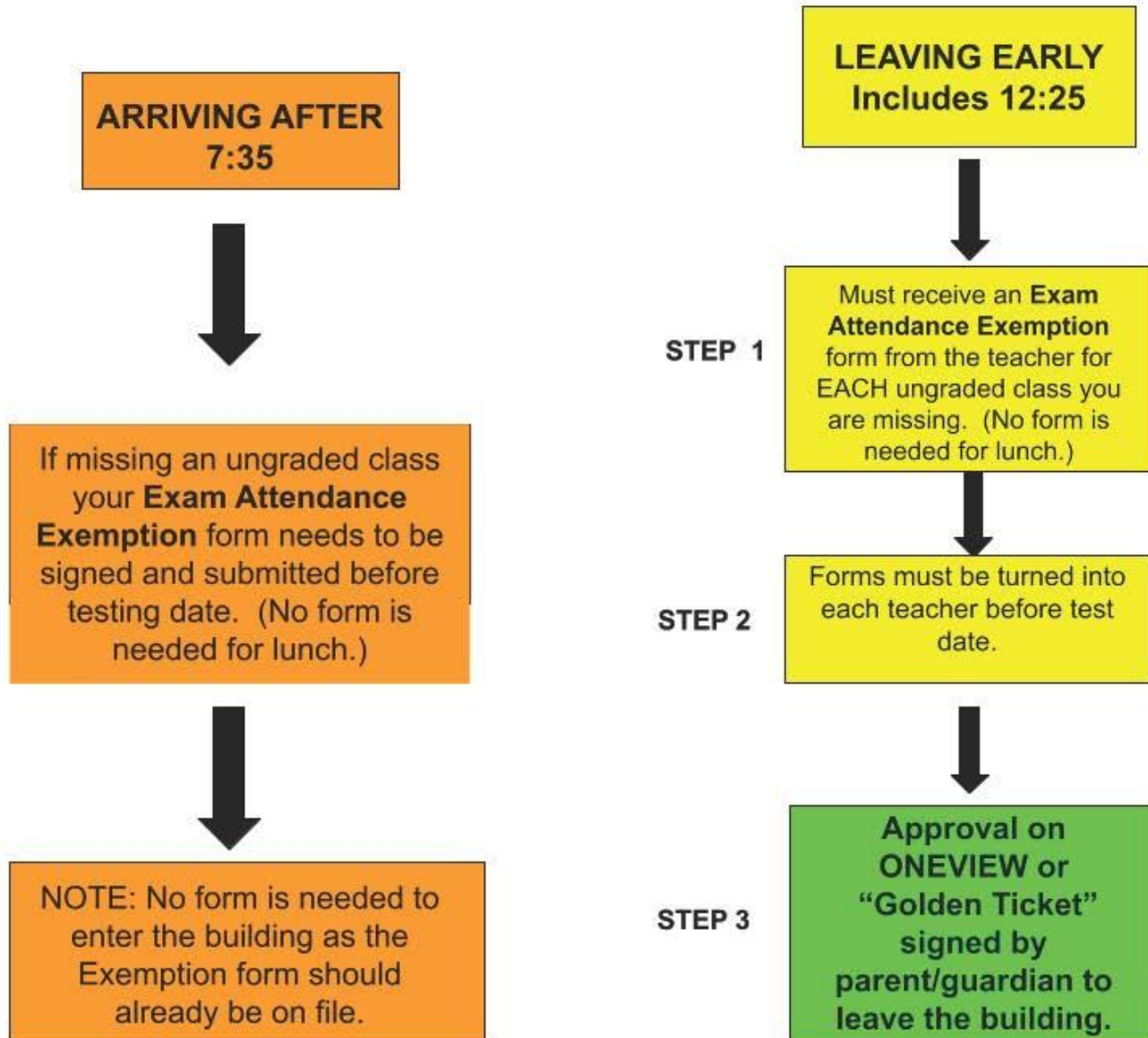

Exam Attendance

Attendance is expected at all exams. **Failure to attend will result in a DNA grade of 0%.** Absence from an exam will be EXCUSED if you have a doctor's note or court note. Parent notes will not be accepted. Please see the following chart for exam periods with ungraded classes.



All absences will be marked excused if we have the above mentioned documents on file before the testing dates. Students who fail to turn in the appropriate documents will be given an unexcused absence and **DNA grade of 0%** if they fail to attend their exam.

Attendance Guidelines for Exams:

1. Students are expected to report on time for every period.
2. Students who do not have an exam scheduled for the first exam period(s) or the last exam period(s) may arrive late/leave early. Leaving early requires EITHER this signed permission slip or permission granted on *OneView*.
3. Students will not be permitted to leave school and return later the same day.
4. Students will need a medical/court note to be excused from an exam. (It will be rescheduled.)
5. Students must have a signed permission form (or permission granted online) to leave at 12:25.

Transportation

1. Morning and afternoon buses will run at the regularly scheduled times.
 - a. A study hall will be provided 12:30-2:25 in the cafeteria
2. Transportation at times other than those listed above is the responsibility of the student/parent(s).

Students should present the permission slip prior to leaving. Students will be permitted to exit through the main doors and the athletic hallway. Note: - After 7:35 students may only enter through the main doors.

Exams are an important part of the academic year, and determine how students earn semester credit. Please be aware of the following to help students manage their obligations.

- Students must arrive to each scheduled exam on time.
- No PCAs are granted during exam week. **Students who fail to attend an exam will receive a DID NOT ATTEMPT (DNA), which is calculated into the final grade as a 0%.**
- Students must pass two out of three scores (Q1, Q2, and Exam). Earning two F's in these marking periods will result in a loss of credit for the semester.

END OF COURSE GOVERNMENT TEST ATTENTION SENIORS!

Any senior enrolled in **American Government** will be participating in state testing on **December 11.** Seniors will report to school for a 7:35 start time. Every student will need a charged chromebook to meet their testing obligations.

NOTE - This does not apply to students in AP US Government

RETESTING for Competency Score ATTENTION GRADES 10-12

Students who have not met competency (684) for **ELA II or Algebra I as needed** for graduation will participate in December testing. In order to give students every chance to meet this graduation requirement, unique testing schedules were created for students. We try to administer tests during the two-hour delay on December 11; however, some students may require additional days and times to complete the requirement.

Students received an **individualized schedule via school email** to notify them of their personalized requirements. All students scheduled to test should report to designated locations with a charged chromebook. If you do not receive an email, you have met your obligation in the standard testing window. As always, you can verify your requirements through the guidance office or with Mrs. Dickerson (Liwo), Assistant Principal of Teaching and Learning.



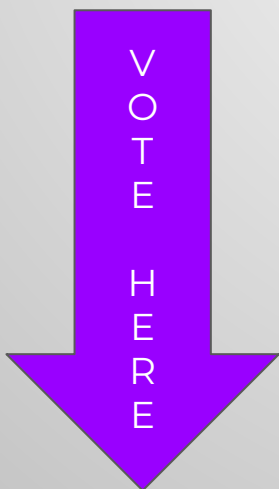
