### Notes from Dr. Vens

Have you noticed a Southview staff member helping with your student's journey through high school?

Our staff theme this year is about airplane pilots. Specifically, we asked teachers to focus on starting and ending lessons, so that students can make meaningful connections to previously learned concepts and understand why the new information is important. Our catchphrase is "a mile of road will take you a mile, but a mile of runway can take you anywhere."
