## **Notes from Principal Vens**

Thursday marked the end of first quarter, and grade cards will be emailed on Friday 10/25/24. The start of second quarter is a reset for a student's grades. Let's take a closer look...

Remember, only a student's <u>semester average</u> appears on their final transcript and impacts the their cumulative GPA. In other words, depending on what happened first quarter, now is either the time to lock in and maintain the good grades or now is the time to put in more work and seek out more in-school support to make sure the second quarter average is higher. Here are two examples of how a semester average is impacted using the Board-approved weighted system of Q1 (40%), Q2 (40%) and Exam (20%)

- Q1 68 D+ / Q2 89 B+ / Exam 86 B 1) FINAL GRADE = 80% B-
- Q1 91 A- / Q2 74 C / Exam 65 D 2) FINAL GRADE = 79% C+

While the ending points are similar for these two hypothetical students, please note the very different second quarter and exam grades they earned, and how those affected the student's final transcript accordingly.

Translation - The time between now and winter break is really important for students' GPAs!





#### HIGH SCHOOL INTRA-DISTRICT OPEN ENROLLMENT 2025-2026

All students enrolled in the Sylvania School District are assigned to the school serving their attendance area. Students enrolled in grades 9-12 may request open enrollment as set forth below, per policy 5113.01.

#### Procedure

Application forms will be available upon request through the Student Support Services Department. You must come to the Office of Student Support Services during office hours to submit an application. Office hours are Monday through Friday 7:30 am - 4:00 pm, please make sure to bring your ID.

The application dates for intra-district open enrollment are as follows: The first school day in October through the third Monday in November. Students enrolling to Sylvania Schools may apply upon their registration process.

#### Criteria per Board Policy and Administrative Guidelines 5113.01

Intra-district open enrollment requests for assignment to Northview or Southview will be honored according to the following criteria:

Student enrollment to the requested school does not exceed the program capacity of each building, currently 1340 students for Northview and 1340 students for Southview.

Student enrollment to the requested school does not exceed the established open enrollment grade/cohort (335) capacity by grade level or special program capacity and size.

Students with attendance/tardy to school issues (fifteen (15) or more combined per school year) and/or disciplinary violations may have their open enrollment revoked/rejected per recommendation of the Director of Student Support Services.

Suspensions and expulsions will be reviewed regarding open enrolled students and may result in rejection/return to their residential District school.

#### Notification

Notifications will be <u>emailed (no phone calls please)</u> from Student Support Services to parent/guardian(s) (email provided on application), building administrators, and school counselors. Applications will be acted upon in the order received by the Director.

Parents will be notified on a rolling basis.

If approved, there will be NO transportation provided for your student.

Students accepted for open enrollment will remain in their approval school for the entire school year.

A new application must be submitted annually by the parent/guardian(s) if the student wishes to continue attending a school outside their residential attendance area.

Students in grades 10-12 who participate in sports, OHSAA guidelines will be followed.

The <u>Ohio Means Jobs Seal</u> is like an abbreviated resume where students can highlight their employability skills; these skills can be developed at school, work or through community organizations and service.

#### WHO CAN EARN THE SEAL?

Any student who is employed, has been employed and still maintains a positive relationship with the past supervisor, participates in community service, works with community organizations like Boys Scouts or church youth groups for example, or career technical students with job/shadowing placements. The expectation is that students are "working" outside of school to develop their employability skills.








# **COUGAR ATHLETICS' NEWS & NOTES**

Ohio House Bill 147 requires all schools to have electronic tickets and cash tickets options at the same price. This house bill also requires schools to offer a reduced student ticket price. The NLL has adopted the following admission charges that will take effect on October 25, 2024:

Section 1 Admission charges in each sport shall be consistent throughout the league for league competition.

Section 2 Admission shall be charged for **varsity football**. The rates charged shall be the following:

**ELECTRONIC TICKETING & CASH OPTION PRICE:** 

**ADULTS** \$10.00

STUDENTS / SENIOR CITIZENS (60 or Older) \$8.00

- Electronic Ticketing Fees will be paid for by the consumer
- Electronic Tickets shall be color coded and verified at entry

Admission shall be charged for varsity and junior varsity volleyball, varsity and junior varsity soccer, varsity and junior varsity boys' and girls' basketball, varsity swimming, varsity baseball, varsity softball, varsity and junior varsity lacrosse, varsity track and all JV and/or Freshman contests when held separately from a varsity contest (on the same date). These contests include the following: Freshmen Football, JV & Freshmen Baseball, JV & Freshmen Softball, JV Soccer, JV & Freshmen Volleyball, JV & Freshmen Basketball (Boys & Girls) and JV & Freshmen Track. The rates charged shall be the following:

ADULTS \$8.00 \*\*

STUDENTS / SENIOR CITIZENS (60 or Older) \$6.00 \*\*
