Advisory Program

- ★ Student-centered program to connect students with each other and with an adult in the building
- ★ Every student has an advisory group with a selected adult
- ★ Details about 6th grade and new students choosing an advisor will be coming soon
- ★ Advisory dates and times will be announced in the coming weeks



Teaming

- ★ Creates an individualized academic environment for students
- ★ Enables teachers to share best practices for curriculum, instruction, assessment, and for individual students
- ★ Fosters collaboration and communication for students
- ★ Broadens friend groups and social interactions
- ★ Offers team meeting times for parents/families
- ★ Creates an identity for students and provides a sense of belonging



Parent Drop Off

- ★ **Morning Drop-off in front of the building**
 - Please pull to the farthest position along the curb in front of the building (nearest to stop sign by pool).
Please do not wait to drop your child off in the center nearest the entrance.
 - Drop-off should occur between 7:35 AM and 8:00 AM.
Tip: Drop off prior to 7:55 to avoid traffic build up



Parent Pick Up

- ★ 2:50 PM- Students called for parent pick up
- ★ Parents/guardians need to park in the swim/practice field parking lot and walk to the front of the building for the assigned time.
- ★ Parents are *not* permitted to park along the curb during this time due to accessible transportation needs.
- ★ SF Staff will greet you and coordinate the sign-out process.



Bus Drop-Off and Pick-Up

★ Bus Transportation

- Every student will be assigned a bus number and bus stop for transportation to and from school
- Bus drop off and pick up is in the rear of the building
- Students will report to lockers, then 6th and 7th grade to the auditorium and 8th grade to the cafeteria upon arrival to school
 - Breakfast is available in the cafeteria for all students
- Questions regarding bussing, contact the transportation office 412-221-4542 ext 417



Lockers

- ★ Each student will be issued their own locker
- ★ Students will receive locker combinations and locations on the first day of school
 - Teachers will provide opportunities for students to practice opening lockers during first week of school



Lunch

- ★ On the first day of school, students will have the opportunity to choose their own seat--teachers will assist in the process
- ★ For safety reasons, seating charts are created based on the student seat selection



Traveling in the Building

- ★ Students should walk on the right side of the hallways
- ★ Stairwells are one direction only and signage has been posted
- ★ Staff will assist in helping students navigate properly and safely through the building

Structure and Organization

- ★ Develop a set time and place for homework and studying to keep your child prepared and organized
- ★ Homework can be written assignments, reviewing learned material, or independent reading
- ★ Check Canvas daily for assignments, videos, daily information, and class resources
 - Proactive approach to assignment completion



Structure and Organization

- ★ Use a planner, agenda, or calendar to track assignments, projects, and assessments.
- ★ Plan ahead by balancing extracurricular participation with school work.
- ★ Use PowerSchool to monitor your child's progress
 - Recommendation: review weekly, with your child present, as part of the homework routine
 - Reactive check of assignment completion



Communications from Middle School

★ School Messenger

- “MS Office” as sender
- Messages are sent to two emails registered in PowerSchool

★ Link to Weekly Announcements

- Sent via School Messenger on the last day of each week
- Can be accessed daily via the website

- ★ List of clubs will be found on the MS website

- ★ Sign-up links announcements by sponsors
- ★ Activity bus at 4:30PM

Getting Involved

- ★ Review electronic communications that come from the Middle School (uses email account registered with PowerSchool)
- ★ Parent Advisory Council quarterly meeting dates are on the district calendar
 - First meeting October 11th at 9:00AM via Google Meet
- ★ Student-Led Conferencing (Fall or Anytime!)



Laptops

- ★ Laptops should remain free from stickers, magnets, etc.
- ★ Students are not permitted to download applications or software.
- ★ The laptop belongs to the school and students should be using the device for educational purposes only.
- ★ Proper care of laptops is essential to avoid fees for drops and damage to laptops
- ★ New laptops will be distributed at the start of the year



Laptops

- ★ Annual Device Forms and Payment
 - Done via “My School Bucks”
 - Email will be sent to all district families from “District Office” Follow instructions in email to sign “Device Loan Agreement and Responsibilities” and pay annual \$25 fee
 - Complete prior to first day of school



Technology Practices

- ★ Know your child's passwords
- ★ Per the Student and Family Handbook, cell phones are not permitted to be used during the school day. When in the building, students' phones must be turned off and stored in their lockers
 - All students needing to go home due to illness must go through the nurse's office



Technology Practices

- ★ Consider turning off all screens (student phones, televisions, other devices) an hour before bedtime
- ★ Create a routine of charging laptops overnight and in a common area (i.e. kitchen, living room, etc.) instead of in students' rooms



Water Bottles

- ★ **Students are permitted to bring a water bottle to school.**
 - **Water bottle must have the student's first and last name marked on it.**
 - **Water bottles are not to be shared between students.**



Attendance

- ★ Parents/Guardians should provide a written note or email to Mrs. Aprea as an excuse if a student is absent from school.
- ★ When in doubt, communicate with Mrs. Aprea, and we will help sort it out and work through it with your family!



Friendships & School Connections

- ★ Friendships often change during the middle school years.
- ★ Help your child identify his or her passions and interests.
- ★ Encourage participation in various clubs, sports, arts, music, and activities.
- ★ Participation in school sponsored activities can be a great way to broaden peer relationships and provide a support network through the middle school years.



Friendships & School Connections

- ★ **Research shows:**
 - **Students are more likely to succeed when they feel connected to school**
 - **Young people who feel connected to school are less likely to engage in risky behaviors**
 - **Increased connection to school promotes motivation, engagement, emotional well-being, and academic performance**



Responsibility

- ★ Students learn responsibility from their actions and consequences only when they take accountability.
- ★ It is best to avoid making excuses or trying to fix problems for our children.
- ★ Some of life's greatest lessons come from making mistakes and facing adversity.
