Eligibility Requirements (before the trip):

Behavior

- It is the expectation that students abide by the Holley CSD Code of Conduct, both leading up to the trip, as well on the trip itself.
- Students may be unable to attend the trip if they are in ISS or OSS during the dates of the trip due to disciplinary referrals.
- Any student that is unable to attend, due to ISS or OSS, will be provided meaningful work that will further their education, while here at school, as well as being monitored by a Holley staff member.

Attendance
