<input type="checkbox"/> Advanced Art 7 <i>Teacher Approval Required</i> _____ <input type="checkbox"/> Art 7	<p><u>ADVANCED ART:</u> Students will learn advanced elements and principles of art. Some art history will be mixed into these lessons. Projects will be used to explore the various types of art. This course is reserved for students that can handle the advanced degree of instruction that will be involved and the higher level of expectations for finished products. Students must have the signed permission of the art teacher in order to register for this course.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> Band 7 (Pre-requisite: Band 6) <input type="checkbox"/> (<i>Counts for TWO Choices</i>)	<p><u>ART:</u> At the seventh grade level students continue to develop and explore through creative experiences. Their foundation of understanding and appreciation become stronger and continues to build.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> Beginning Band <input type="checkbox"/> (<i>Counts for TWO Choices</i>) (Check one) ___ Clarinet ___ Trombone ___ Flute ___ Trumpet	<p><u>BAND:</u> Students will work on developing instrumental technique, instrumental range, and their musical knowledge and skill. Students will perform in concerts, pep rallies, assemblies, and so forth. Attendance is required at all band events, including those in the evening. The level of instruction and depth of study increases with each passing month and with each school year. This course meets every day for the ENTIRE school year.</p>
<input type="checkbox"/> Chorus 7 <input type="checkbox"/> (<i>Counts for TWO Choices</i>)	<p><u>BEGINNING BAND:</u> This course is only offered to 1st semester 7th graders who did not take Band in 6th grade, and it involves a transition at the semester point into Band 7. Attendance is required at all band events, including those in the evening. See the Band description above for further details regarding the course. This course meets every day for the ENTIRE school year.</p>

They will learn to use their voices properly, learn to read musical notation, play the keyboard, understand characteristics of various vocal and choral styles of music, and learn appropriate "etiquette" in a variety of performance and rehearsal settings. All musical genres are open to view. Attendance is required at all choral events, including those in the evening. This course meets every day for the ENTIRE school year.</p>
<p><i>*School Specific Elective—See Course Descriptions</i></p>	<p><u>CONTINUING SPANISH 7: Spanish 6 is a prerequisite for this class.</u> This semester-long course expands the study and research of the Spanish language. The historical and current culture of various Spanish-speaking countries are investigated while developing listening, speaking and pre-reading/writing skills. This is a non-sequential course and is offered to 7th and 8th graders.</p>
<p>Student Signature _____</p>	<p><u>EXPLORING ANIMAL & PLANT SCIENCES:</u> This course allows students to explore the plant, animal, and natural resources industries within agriculture. Students will learn key concepts and skills used by professionals in the industry such as food production, principles of plant growth, and wildlife and natural resource management. Career options within the industry will be explored and career skills will be emphasized through job shadowing, service learning, and the Supervise Agricultural Experience (SAE) program. Leadership and personal growth will be developed through involvement in the FFA, the youth leadership organization for students in Agricultural Education, including competitions, workshops, conventions, and community service projects.</p>
<p>Parent signature _____</p>	<p><u>EXPLORING THE ENGINEERING DESIGN PROCESS:</u> Students will focus on the process by which products are invented and innovated. Using the Engineering Design Process, students will discover how creating new products will trigger intended and unintended impacts. There is a main focus on how inventions and innovations are the result of demands, values and interests of individuals, industries and societies. <i>*(NAMS Only)</i></p>
	<p><u>FUNDAMENTALS OF BIOTECHNOLOGY:</u> This course teaches students the foundation of Biotechnology with topics that include Medical Terminology and Math, Lab Safety, Infection Control, and Cellular Design and DNA. <i>*(SAMS Only)</i></p>
	<p><u>MICROSOFT OFFICE APPLICATIONS:</u> This course is designed to provide hands-on instruction in basic computer skills, concepts, and software applications. Emphasis is placed on extending and reinforcing keying skills while providing experience for learning word processing, spreadsheet, graphics, multimedia, and telecommunications applications. Communication skills and basic mathematical concepts are reinforced in this course. Work-based learning strategies appropriate for this course are field trips and job shadowing.</p>
	<p><u>PERFORMING ARTS:</u> The drama/performance elective provides an introduction to theatre arts. Students participate in group improvisational activities to help them become comfortable performing in front of an audience. They are introduced to the elements of acting technique: imagination building, projection, and articulation, and basic staging skills. Students may write and perform plays.</p>
	<p><u>SPANISH 7:</u> This is a semester-long beginner's course that explores the Spanish language and culture of various Spanish-speaking countries. The emphasis of this course is on listening, speaking and pre-reading/writing. This is a non-sequential course and is offered to 6th, 7th and 8th graders.</p>
