


#### **Arrival/Dismissal Procedures**

Thank you to everyone for your patience during arrival and dismissal. We have many new children arriving in cars and trying to learn new car numbers. This year's car numbers are on yellow cards. Please remember to give a new tag to anyone picking up your child. For your child's safety, anyone picking up a child without a new tag will be asked to provide a picture ID and their name must be listed on the sign-out sheet.

We will have a Cowpens Police Officer out front daily at 2:10 PM to assist with traffic. The officer will not allow cars to pass other cars waiting in line on Foster Street. The line of traffic can be avoided if you arrive around 2:40. You must pick-up your child prior to 2:50 daily.

Your cooperation allows us to get everyone in and out safely.



#### Free Meals For ALL!

Beginning September 14, 2020, free meals will be provided for all D3 students. This includes free breakfast and lunch on campus for in-person students and 5 day meal kits free for D3 students enrolled in our Virtual Program. No applications are required. #### Notes from PE.....



As we begin another year in PE, I have just a few reminders for you. For safety purposes, flip flops are not allowed in PE. Your child needs to wear tennis shoes on PE days. If your child wears flip flops, they will not be able to participate that day. I ask that you please have your child dressed appropriately on their designated PE day. Appropriate dress includes soft-soled shoes (lace up or Velcro only). Children should not be dressed in clothing that may prohibit activity or become tangled in equipment. Examples would be excessively bagay clothing, loose belts, or long skirts. Appropriate dress does not include sandals, slip-ons, or hard-soled shoes. Dresses are acceptable as long as pants or shorts are worn underneath.
