

Applying for College Credit Plus



- Apply at <u>www.walsh.edu/ccp.html</u>
- Students from private schools must apply to Walsh by <u>March 15th</u> in order to have enough time to receive their acceptance letter to apply for funding by April 1.
- Submit official high school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores (if taken) to the Office of Admissions.

A) Criteria for student eligibility

(1) A student is eligible for the "College Credit Plus" program if the student meets any of the following criteria:

(a) Obtains a remediation-free score on one of the standard assessment exams as set forth in paragraph (D)(2) of rule <u>3333-1-65.3</u> of the Administrative Code; or

(b) Has a cumulative unweighted high school grade point average of at least 3.00; or

(c) Has a cumulative unweighted high school grade point average of at least 2.75 but less than 3.00 and received an "A" or "B" grade in a relevant high school course.

(2) If a student is seeking to participate under section 3365.033 of the Revised Code and a cumulative unweighted high school grade point average is not available to determine eligibility under paragraph (A)(1)(b) or (A)(1)(c) of this rule, the student is eligible if the student has received an "A" or "B" grade in a relevant high school course.

(a). English 18, Reading 22, and Math 22 (from above)


- If a student plans to take a math and/or English course, ACT/SAT/placement testing scores will be required to determine eligibility
- Walsh placement testing will be available on March 16th

Steps to Apply for Funding



- Create an OH | ID Account
 - A parent/guardian must create an OH | ID Account at <u>https://ohid.ohio.gov</u> by **April 1**
- Declare Intent to Participate
 - Electronically declare your intent to participate through your OH | ID Account by **April 1**. (This is part of the funding application).
- Complete & Submit Application
 - Complete all sections
 - Upload requested documents (Example: Acceptance Letter)
 - Submit no later than April 1 (no exceptions!)
- Before May 6, you will receive your funding award notification in your OH | ID Account
- Funding letters must be uploaded as a PDF by July 1 at https://www.walsh.edu/ccp.html (Failing to do so will result in paying for credits out of pocket)

Self-paying for Classes



- Why would a student self-pay?
 - They did not complete the funding application process on time
 - A student did not receive enough funding
 - *Example*: A student wants to take 12 credit hours but was only award 6 funded hours
- Self-pay rate: \$166.55 per credit hour for 2023-2024
 - \$166.55 x 3 credit hours = \$499.65 per class

Once a Student is Accepted:



- Students will receive an official acceptance letter via email (sent to email used when applying)
- Students must submit Walsh's CCP Permission Slip (This will be attached to the acceptance email)
- Students must submit a Student Questionnaire
- Tentative Registration Day at the high schools and/or appointments with Walsh's Professional Advisors
- CCP orientation will be held in August

Course Regulations



Courses Not Allowed in CCP

- Private applied courses with one-onone instruction (such as music lessons)
- Courses with high fees
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- Pass/Fail graded courses
- Remedial courses or religious courses.

- Elementary Functions I MATH 155 Fall Semester
 - Covers Topics in Pre-Calculus
 - Based on ACT scores (23-24)
- Elementary Functions II MATH 156 Fall Semester
 - Covers Topics in Trigonometry
 - Based on ACT scores (25-26) or "C" or better in Math 155
- Statistics MATH 221 Year long Fall and Spring Semester
 - Based on ACT scores (23-24)
- Calculus I MATH 207 Year long Fall and Spring Semester
 - Based on ACT scores (27+) or "C" or better in MATH 156
- English Composition I ENG 101 Fall Semester
 - Based on ACT scores (sum of English and Reading 40-44)

Frequently Asked Questions



- Is the Accuplacer available at Walsh University for College Credit Plus assessment? No, Walsh University does not offer the Accuplacer. Students must take the ACT or SAT and submit scores by the admissions deadline.
- Do CCP students need a parking pass?

Yes, parking passes are mailed to all CCP students over the summer and there is no cost. Should students need a new pass, these can be picked up in the Student Affairs Office.


• Are the CCP courses transferable?

Yes, our courses descriptions follow Transfer Assurance Guidelines (TAG). To know for sure, students can contact the college that they would like to transfer a course to.

Frequently Asked Questions



- Who provides textbooks for CCP? Non-public high schools are required to provide textbooks for CCP students. Students should talk to their guidance counselors about their school's textbook policy.
- Can CCP students take summer courses? Yes, CCP guidelines state that students can take summer classes which become part of the total number of credit hours they are able to take for the following academic year.
