Golden Apple Award Nominations Needed Honor a Fabulous SPJ Teacher!!

Through the generosity and kindness of the Donahue Family Foundation, the Golden Apple Award program is again seeking nominations to honor outstanding individuals who devote their lives to teaching in Catholic schools. This award is bestowed annually on four elementary teachers, two high school teachers, and one principal currently working at one of our schools.



Candidates must be a practicing Catholic, full-time teacher or principal and have completed a minimum of three full years teaching or being a principal in the elementary or secondary school at which he/she is currently serving.

Nominations are currently being accepted at the individual schools. The letter of nomination should explain why the nominator feels the individual deserves the Golden Apple Award and include specific examples of the individual's unique qualities and teaching ability. Nominations are accepted from a parent, and elementary student with his/her parent, a high school student, or a fellow teacher. Please see your local school for the nomination form. Completed nominations should be submitted to the school principal no later than February 9th. **Please use the attached cover letter when submitting your nomination.**

Snow Days (The best days ever!!) This year for information on school closing for snow days you will be informed through Message Made Easy. Families will receive a text, email, and phone call alerting them of the change in schedule. You can also follow the school closing reports online. SS Philip and James follow the closing of Northwest Local School. Incase of a snow day call off, your child <u>does not</u> need to report to virtual classes.



Assignments will be turned in on the next in-school day. If snow days occur during a remote learning period, classes are canceled for that day and will resume when the inclement weather restrictions are lifted.

Important Changes to the School Calendar

Student Illness

Parents and Guardians,

"No goofing around", with flu season upon us, here is a refresher of what to do if your child is sick. Thank you for helping keep SPJ healthy!!

The school is aware that there are many reasons a child may become ill. Regardless of the illness, a parent should keep the child home until the illness's symptoms disappear. If a child has a fever, he or she must be fever-free without the use of fever reducing medication for 24 hours. A parent or guardian is required to call the student off from school each day he or she is ill, and a note describing the reason for the absence from school must be sent. A doctor's clearance may be required for return to school.
