Applying for College Credit Plus

- Apply at <u>www.walsh.edu/ccp.html</u>
 - Deadline: April 1, 2020
- Submit official high school transcripts and ACT/SAT scores to Office of Admissions.
 - Students who have not yet taken the ACT may be considered for conditional acceptance pending the receipt of satisfactory ACT scores if they have met all other admission requirements. (Request these documents from high school Guidance Counselor).
- Meet the Assessment Threshold Score to be considered eligible, determined by the state.

Steps to Apply for Funding

Create an OH | ID Account

A parent/guardian must create an OH | ID Account at https://ohid.ohio.gov by April 1. (The SAFE Portal has been integrated with the OH | ID System).

Declare Intent to Participate

• Electronically declare your intent to participate through your OH | ID Account by **April 1**. (This is part of the funding application).

Complete & Submit Application

- Complete all sections
- Upload requested documents (Example: Acceptance Letter)
- Submit no later than April 1 (no exceptions!)
- In May, you will receive your funding award notification in your OH | ID Account
- Funding letters must be uploaded as a PDF by June 1 at https://www.walsh.edu/ccp.html (Failing to do so will result in paying for credits out of pocket).

Self-paying for Classes

• Why would a student self-pay?

- They did not complete the funding application process on time
- A student did not receive enough funding
 - **Example**: A student wants to take 12 credit hours but was only award 6 funded hours
- Self-pay rate: \$166.55 per credit hour for 2020-2021
 - \$166.55 x 3 credit hours = \$499.65 per class

Once a Student is Accepted

- Students will receive an official acceptance letter in the mail
- Tentative Registration Day at the high schools and/or appointments with Walsh's Professional Advisors
- CCP orientation will be held in August

Course Regulations

Courses Not Allowed in CCP

- Private applied courses with one-onone instruction (such as music lessons)
- Courses with high fees
- Study abroad courses
- Physical education courses
- Pass/Fail graded courses
- Remedial courses or religious courses.

 - Prerequisite: MATH 104 or equivalent
- Calculus I (MATH 207) Year long
 - Prerequisite: MATH 156 with a grade of "C" or better or placement

 - Based on placement

 - Open to students who took MATH 155 with a grade of "C" or better

Frequently Asked Questions

Is the Accuplacer available at Walsh University for College Credit Plus assessment?

No, Walsh University does not offer the Accuplacer. Students must take the ACT or SAT and submit scores by the admissions deadline.

Do CCP students need a parking pass?

Yes, parking passes are mailed to all CCP students over the summer and there is no cost. Should students need a new pass, these can be picked up in the Student Affairs Office.

Are the CCP courses transferable?

Yes, our courses descriptions follow Transfer Assurance Guidelines (TAG). To know for sure, students can contact the college that they would like to transfer a course to.

Frequently Asked Questions

Who provides textbooks for CCP?

Non-public high schools are required to provide textbooks for CCP students. Students should talk to their guidance counselors about their school's textbook policy.

Can CCP students take summer courses?

Yes, CCP guidelines state that students can take summer classes which become part of the total number of credit hours they are able to take for the following academic year. Walsh's summer courses are rigorous 5-week classes that meet every weekday.
