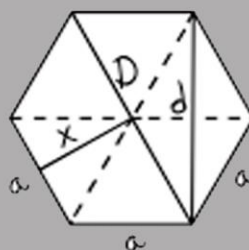

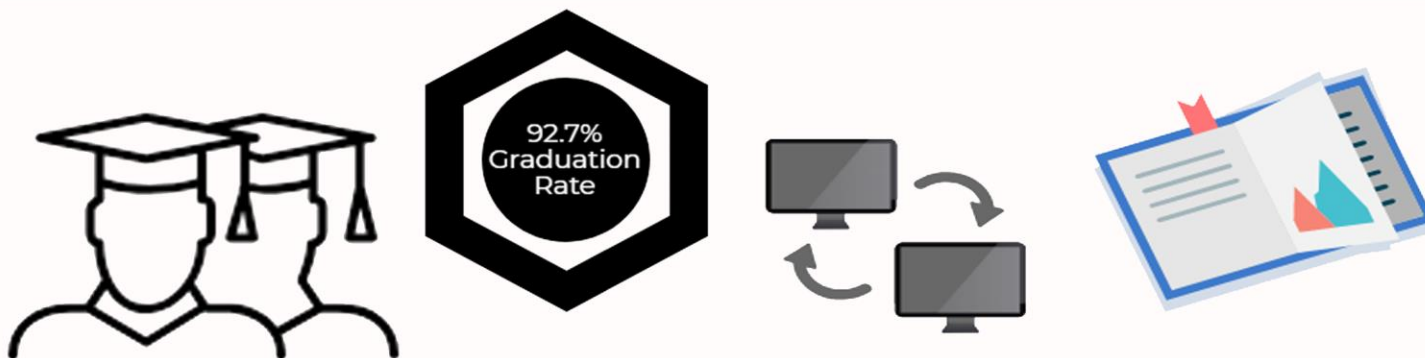

# OUR ACADEMIC FOCUS



As a public school district entrusted with developing the next generation of Circleville Tigers, our K-12 academic road map is dynamic in design with an emphasis on literacy, digital literacy and Science Technology Engineering Mathematics (STEM), and career development. All of these real world skills, infused in our classrooms, provide our students with a framework to be successful and engaged citizens within their community upon graduation. With graduation being our long-range priority, Circleville City Schools posted a 92.7% graduation rate in 2018.

## Measures of Academic Progress

Beyond annual state assessments, we are invested in an analytics process that tracks student progress quarterly that provides staff, students, and families with the data to modify instruction and help students reach their full potential.

At Circleville City we administer Measures of Academic Progress (MAP) assessments three times a year to help our staff make informed decisions about instruction to craft individualized lesson plans

for students in Math and Reading ahead of state assessments—one more way we prepare students for state assessments and grade level promotion.



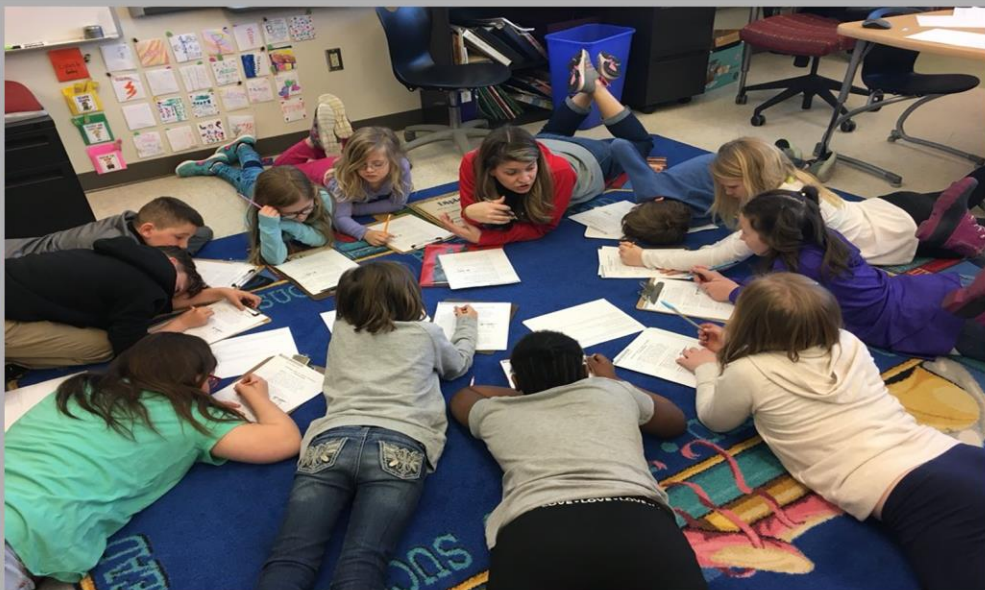
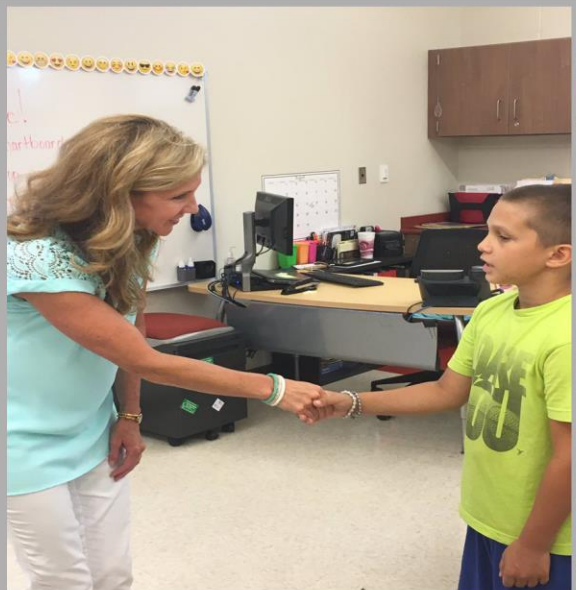
## Robotics, STEM, and Coding

Starting at the elementary level, we are proud to offer a 1 to 1 technology ratio district wide. Through that initiative and with other supports we proudly offer Problem-Based Learning (PBL) in the form of computer coding, keyboarding instruction, Google Suite lessons, summer STEM camps, elementary tinker carts, Genius Hour coding and programming at the middle school and high school, and an award winning robotics program at CHS.





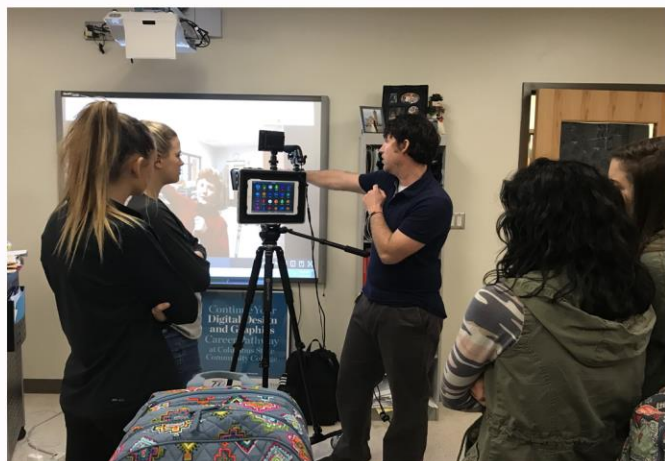
# OUR EDUCATORS



Circleville City Schools is comprised of **260+ educators** that make up our **TIGER FAMILY**. Our educators come in many forms – teachers, counselors, custodians, instructional aides, principals, bus drivers, treasurers, cooks, administrators, and administrative assistants– each with a desire to advance their community through the education of their students. While not every employee oversees direct classroom instruction, they do directly contribute to the daily development of the **Tigers in our care**. With each new Kindergarten class we enroll in our elementary school, our staff strives to guide our students throughout their academic journey – helping them to discover their talents and provide them a model for success along the way.

## *Tiger Academy*

In addition to monthly trainings with Dr. McCune, Circleville City Schools staff also participates in a bi-annual professional development program called the Tiger Academy. The Tiger Academy is a two-week long seminar for staff held twice a year in June and August. This professional development initiative is a way for educators to earn contact credit hours for license renewal taught by a university instructor, become certified in software-based educational programs such as Google Classroom, and stay up-to-date with best-practice instructional strategies in their different content areas. Orchestrated by our Curriculum Director Mrs. Lisa Heins, Circleville City Schools staff is committed to broadening the depths of their student instruction through year-round learning.

## MILITARY FRIENDLY RECOGNIZED SCHOOLS

In May 2018, the district was recognized by the Ohio Department of Education as a Purple Star Recipient. The Purple Star designation is placed on schools that are military friendly, host an annual military themed event, and designate a liaison to assist active duty families with streamlining supports for their child's education.



## 5-STAR RATED PRESCHOOL PROGRAM

Effective November 12th, 2017 and running through November 11th of 2020, the State of Ohio has awarded the Circleville Elementary Preschool a 5-star Step Up to Quality rating for meeting quality standards established by the Ohio Department of Job and Family Services (ODJFS) and the Ohio Department of Education (ODE). Step Up to Quality is a Five-star tiered quality rating and improvement system created to recognize and promote early learning and development programs that meet quality standards over time and that are continuously above the health and safety licensing requirements set forth by the state.

## STUDENT HEALTH - THE BERGER-TIGER CARE CLINIC

In August of 2017, the district launched our Berger-Tiger Care Clinic in partnership with Berger Health System. Recognizing there can be barriers to health care services, this opt-in on site clinic operates on campus three days a week and is staffed by certified nurse practitioners from Berger who work with families to provide care that cuts down on appointment times and keeps our students healthy and in the classroom.

From our innovative 21st Century classrooms to the stage in our high school auditorium, we have been fortunate enough to be put in a position to be good stewards of the environment we educate our students in and the facilities in which we host our Circleville families and community.

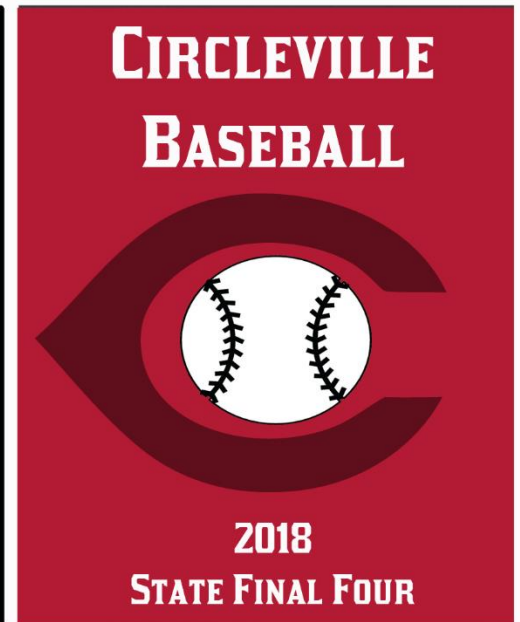
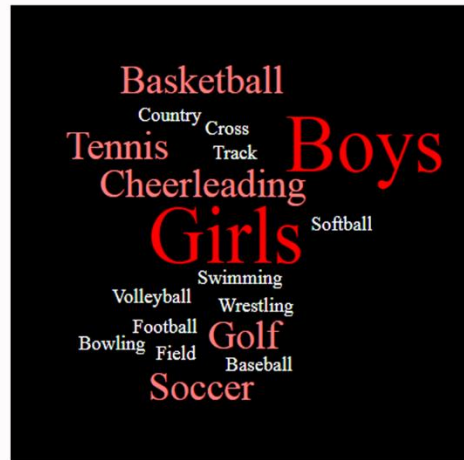

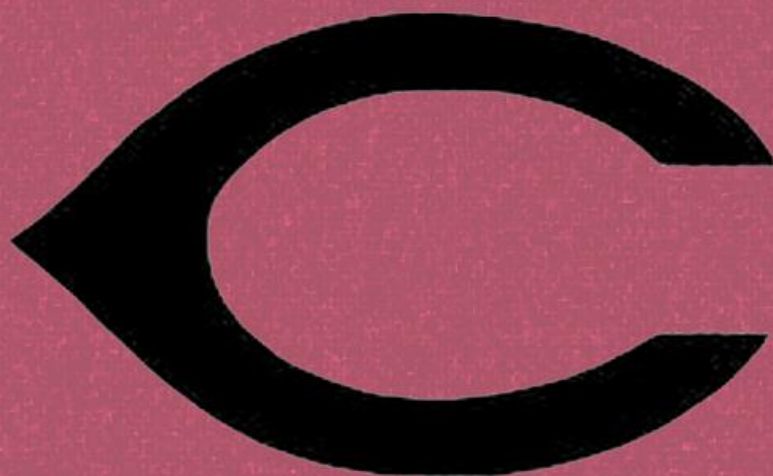
