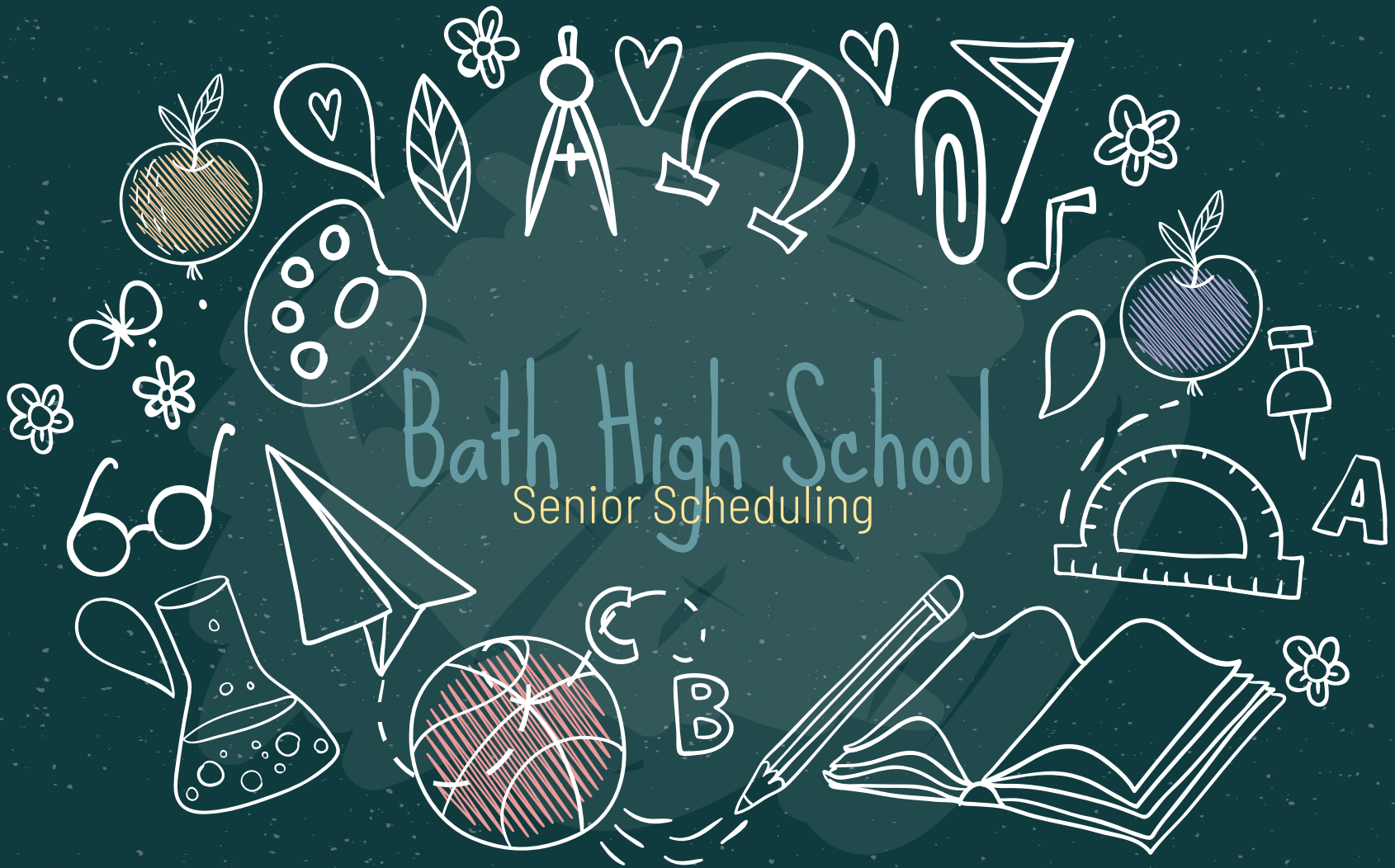

#### SECOND: SHOW COMPETENCY

Earn competency score of 684 or higher on Algebra I and ELA II OST/End of Course

**OR**

**Option 1: Demonstrate Two Career Focused Activities**  
**Foundational:** Proficient scores on WebXams, A 12pt. Industry Credential, a pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program.  
**Supporting:** Work-based learning. Earn the required score on WorkKeys Exam, or the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal

**OR**

**Option 2: Enlist in the Military**  
 Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation

**OR**

**Option 3: Complete College Coursework**  
 Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through CCP.

**OR**

**Option 4: ACT or SAT**  
 Earn **remediation-free score** in the math or English subject areas on the ACT or SAT. To demonstrate competency in ELA II, a student must be remediation-free in subjects of English and Reading on the ACT or SAT.

It is the student's responsibility to see that requirements for graduation are met. Bath High School will make every effort to keep up-to-date records and to keep students and parents informed about the status of progress toward necessary course work for graduation requirements.

### Seal Requirements:

- The Ohio Department of Education requires all graduates in the Class of 2023 and Beyond earn a minimum of two diploma seals for graduation. One seal MUST be a state (Ohio) seal. Please see a brief description below of each.

**OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal (Ohio)** Must demonstrate certain professional skills required for success in the workplace. Students work with at least three experienced and trusted mentors who validate the demonstration of these skills in school, work, or the community.

**Industry-Recognized Credential Seal (Ohio)** Earn an approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.

**College-Ready Seal (Ohio)** Earn remediation-free ACT scores; currently these are English 18 or higher, Reading 22 or higher, and Mathematics 22 or higher- these values are subject to change

**Military Enlistment Seal (Ohio)** Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces; or participate in an approved JROTC program

**Citizenship Seal (Ohio)** Earn a score of proficient or higher on both the American History and American Government end-of-course exams; earn a final course grade of B or higher in both high school American History and American Government courses.

**Science Seal (Ohio)** Earn the Science Seal is by earning a score of proficient or higher on the biology end-of-course examination; earn a final course grade of B or higher in an advanced science course

**Honors Diploma Seal (Ohio)** Students can earn one of the following: Academic Honors Diploma; International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma; Career-Tech Honors Diploma; STEM Honors Diploma; Arts Honors Diploma; Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma (See next page for details)

**Seal of Biliteracy (Ohio)** Must show proficiency in English and another language. One of the options for showing proficiency in English is earning a score of proficient or higher on the ELA II EOC, as well as a foreign language competency exam.

**Technology Seal (Ohio)** A student can earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program.

**Community Service Seal (Local)** Student must have 12 hours of documented community service during 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade and show signed approval from the organization.

**Fine and Performing Arts Seal (Local)** Successful completion of 2 semesters of a fine or performing art course within 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade (successful completion means a C or higher both semesters); documentation comes from course grade being on transcript.

**Student Engagement Seal (Local)** Throughout the 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade, students must successfully participate in 2 seasons of a sport(s), 2 seasons of marching band, 2 years of show choir and/or jazz band, or 2 semesters of participation in a school approved organization(s) or club(s) and both organization advisors and/or coaches must sign approval form.

# Honors Diploma

- Students must meet 7 of 8 requirements

## Students can replace

- ACT/SAT
- GPA
- World Language

### *With*

- College Credit Plus: 12 total College Credit Plus credits
- Advanced Placement: three courses with score of 3 or higher on AP tests
- Career-Technical Assurance Guide (CTAG): 12 total credits
- Apprenticeship/Pre-Apprenticeship: Completion or Evidence of Acceptance if required to be older than 18
- WorkKeys: Score of 6 or higher on all tests (\*void for Career-Tech Honors Diploma)
- Armed Services Vocational Battery: Score of 50 or above on the ASVAB
- Work-Based Learning: 250 total hours of work-based learning

<u>Requirements</u>	<u>State Minimum</u>
<u>Math</u>	4 credits: Fourth math must be > Algebra 2
<u>Science</u>	4 credits: One additional unit Advanced Science
<u>Social Studies</u>	4 credits: One additional unit of Social Studies
<u>World Languages</u>	Three sequential units of one world language, or no less than 2 sequential units of two world languages studied (ex. 3 years of Spanish)
<u>GPA</u>	3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale
<u>ACT/SAT</u>	ACT: Score of 27 or higher, SAT: Score of 1280 or higher
<u>Seal Requirement</u>	Earn two additional diploma seals, not including Honors Diploma Seal. Beyond the required 2 for graduation. (Ex. 4 total seals)
<u>Experiential Learning</u>	Field Experience, OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal*, Portfolio or Work-Based Learning

The courses selected will determine the master schedule of classes for the next year. **Registration in a course requires a commitment on your part to that course.** You have freedom of choice regarding the classes you and your parents select for the coming school year.

Changes will be considered for the following reasons only:

**LACK OF REQUIRED COURSE:** If you are missing a course that is a graduation requirement OR you failed a mandatory course and need to repeat the course.

**FAILURE TO MEET PREREQUISITES:** If you registered for a course, but failed to meet the prerequisites mandatory for that course.

**PROCEDURAL ERRORS:** A course code incorrectly inputted.

**SUMMER:** Students who complete a course for credit recovery or CCP in summer school for which they are scheduled will be permitted to substitute another class for that course only.

**CCP:** Registered for an equivalent CCP course.



# Course Change Policy

# College Credit Plus

This program permits any qualified students, grades 7 through 12, to enroll in college on a full or part time basis for nonsectarian courses for which they may receive high school and/or college credit. College Credit Plus courses can be taken in the summer or either semester with a maximum of 30 semester hours per year. Complete information regarding this program will be available to parents during CCP night on Wednesday, February 19th at 7:00 PM in the auditorium.



All signed CCP forms due to the Guidance Office on or before **April 1st**.

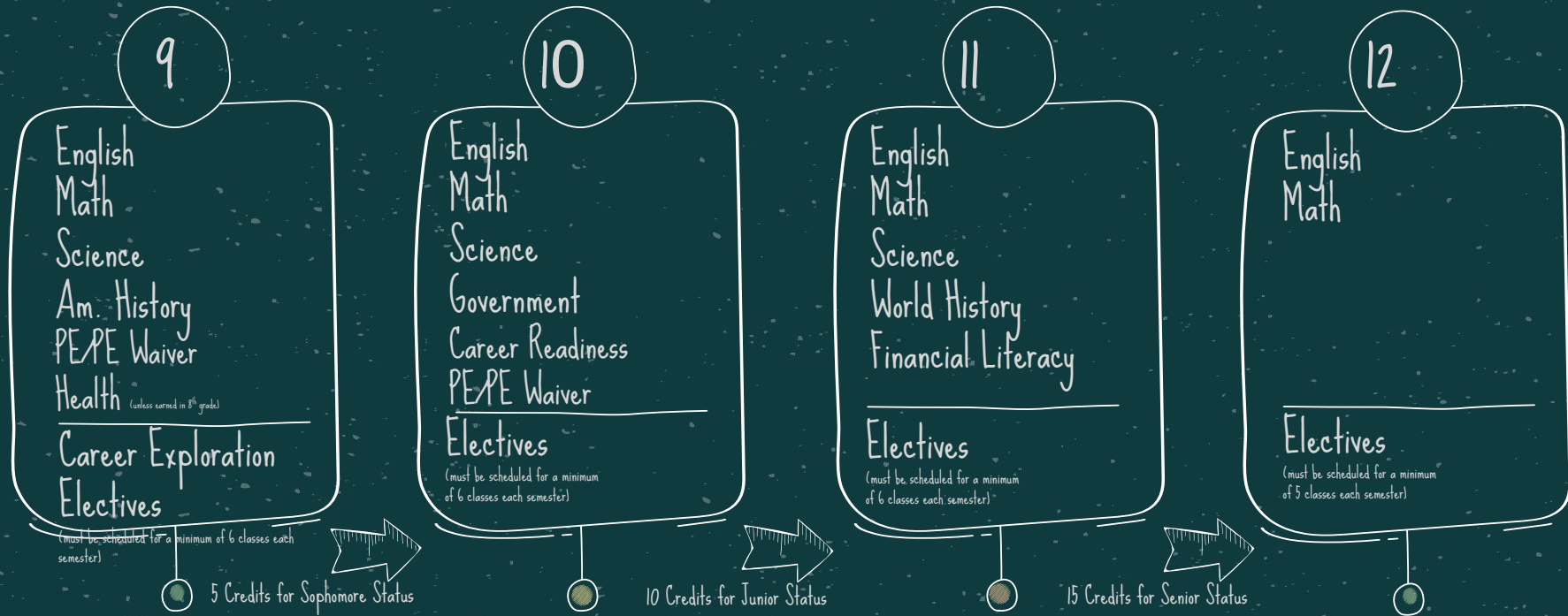

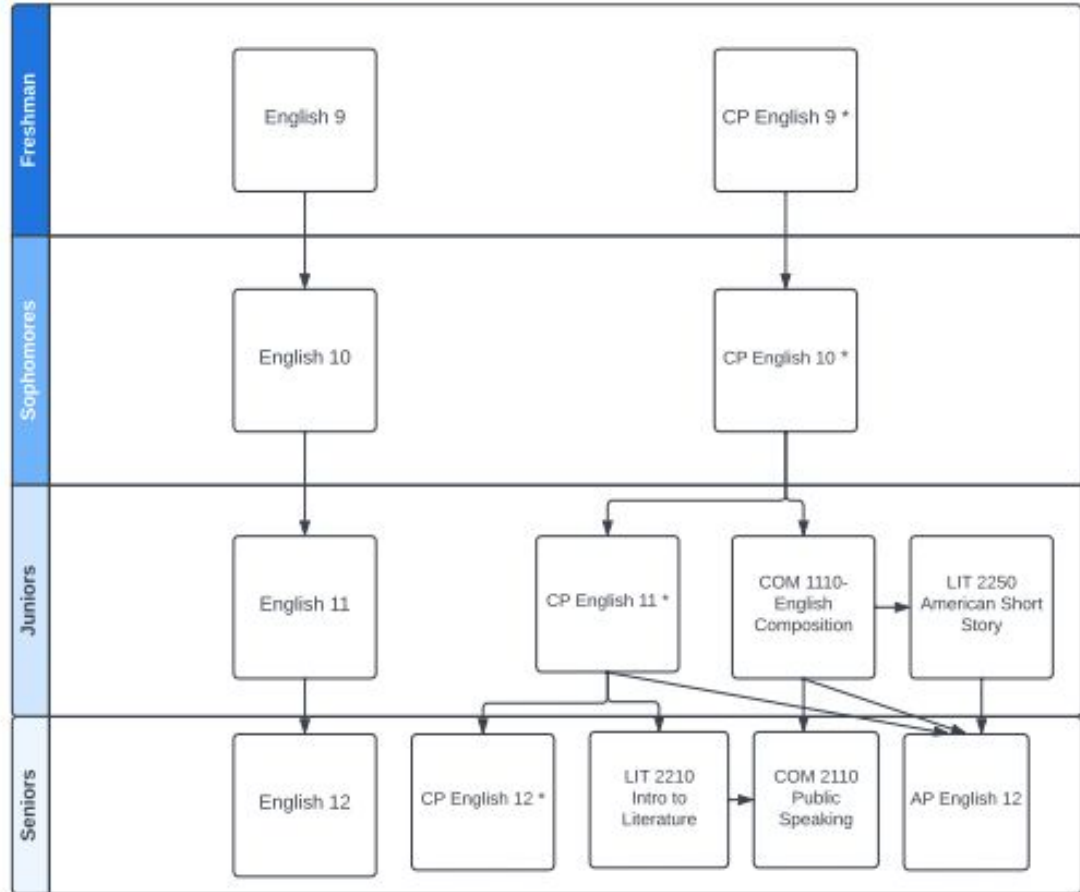
# Four-Year Planner of Required Courses

Bath High School Curriculum Map

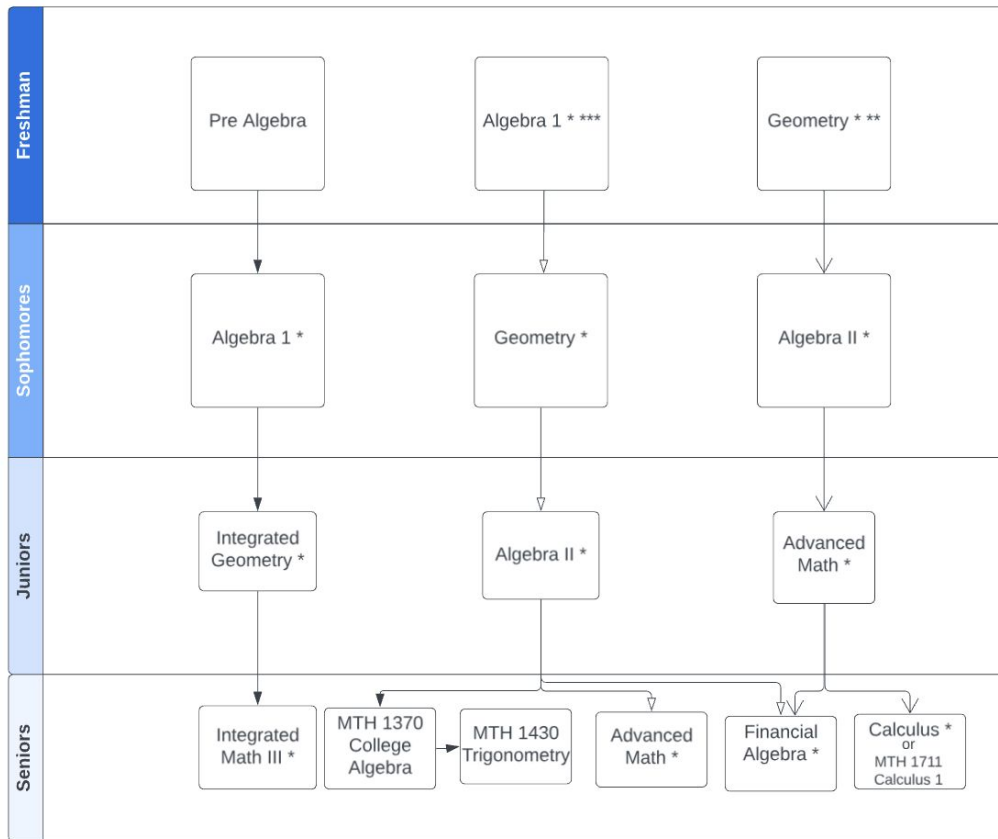

## Math Department Bath High School Curriculum Map



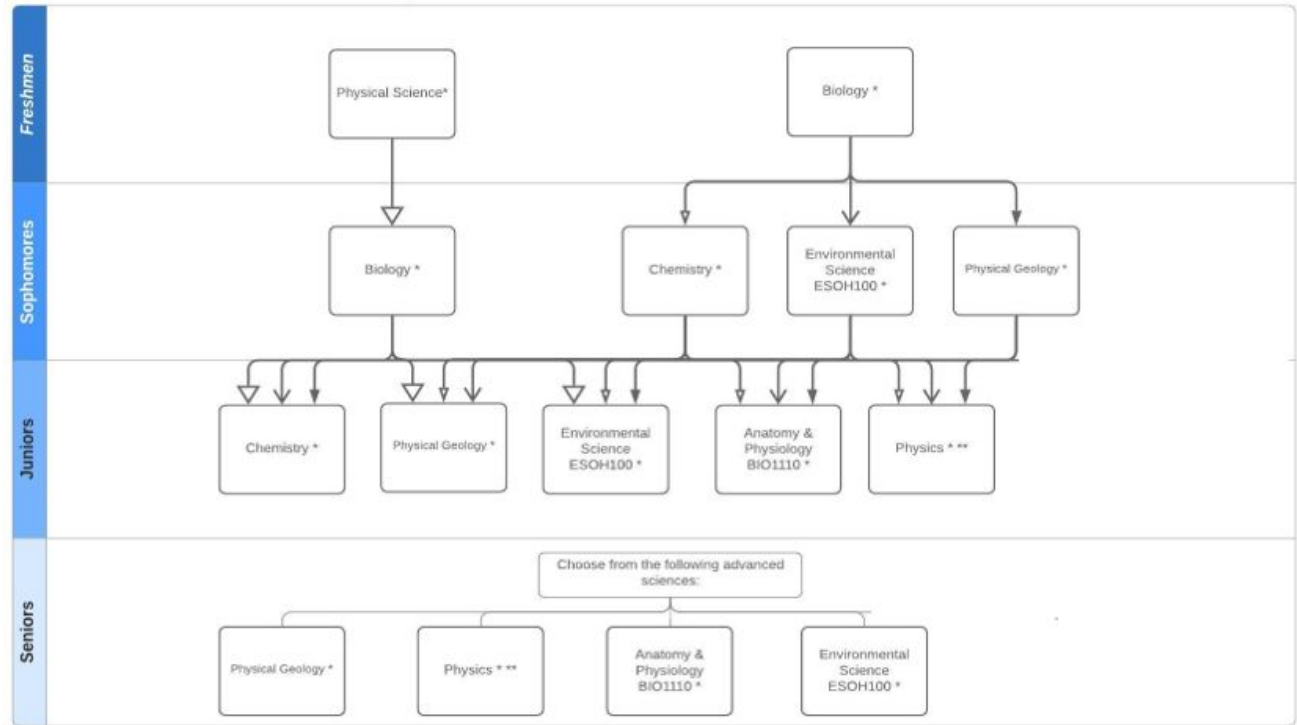

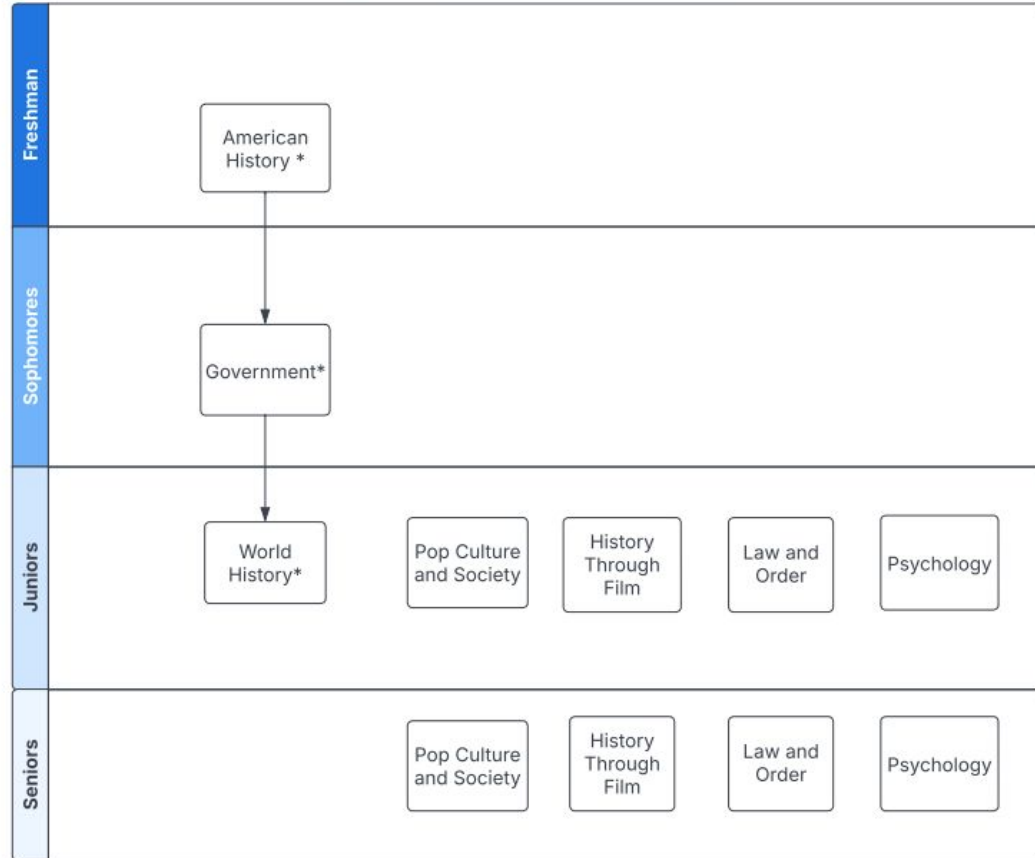

### Senior Scheduling Reminders:

- Every effort will be made to ensure that students are properly placed in the classes that they request during the registration process. However, if there are conflicts in class periods priority will go to core courses and courses required for graduation.
- Students and parents must give serious consideration now when selecting courses. **Schedules are not changed unless one of the following criterion have occurred:**
  - Lack of a required course
  - Failure to meet a prerequisite
  - Course completed in summer
  - Procedural error
  - Registering for an equivalent CCP course
- All students need to be aware of their graduation requirements including 20 credits and testing requirements.
- All students must be passing the equivalent of five courses for eligibility and full-time student status. (PE does not count towards eligibility)
