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

FIRST: COVER THE BASICS

SECOND: SHOW COMPETENCY

OR

Option 1: Demonstrate Two Career Focused Activities Foundational: Proficient scores on WebXams, A 12pt.

<u>Foundational</u>: Proficient scores on WebXams, A 12pt. Industry Credential, a pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program. <u>Supporting</u>: Work-based learning, Earn the required score on WorkKeys Exam, or the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal

OR

Option 2: Enlist in the Military Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation

OR

Option 3: Complete College Coursework Earn credit for one college-level math and/or collegelevel English course through CCP.

OR

Option 4: ACT or SAT

Earn <u>remediation-free score</u> in the math or English subject areas on the ACT or SAT. To demonstrate competency in ELA II, a student must be remediationfree in subjects of English and Reading on the ACT or SAT.

Seal Requirements:

 The Ohio Department of Education requires all graduates in the Class of 2023 and Beyond earn a minimum of two diploma seals for graduation. One seal MUST be a state (Ohio) seal. Please see a brief description below of each.

OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal (Ohio) Must demonstrate certain professional skills required for success in the workplace. Students work with at least three experienced and trusted mentors who validate the demonstration of these skills in school, work, or the community.

Industry-Recognized Credential Seal (Ohio) Earn an approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.

College-Ready Seal (Ohio) Earn remediation-free ACT scores; currently these are English 18 or higher, Reading 22 or higher, and Mathematics 22 or higher- these values are subject to change

Military Enlistment Seal (Ohio) Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces; or participate in an approved JROTC program

Citizenship Seal (Ohio) Earn a score of proficient or higher on both the American History and American Government end-of-course exams; earn a final course grade of B or higher in both high school American History and American Government courses.

Science Seal (Ohio) Earn the Science Seal is by earning a score of proficient or higher on the biology end-of-course examination; earn a final course grade of B or higher in an advanced science course

Honors Diploma Seal (Ohio) Students can earn one of the following: Academic Honors Diploma; International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma; Career-Tech Honors Diploma; STEM Honors Diploma; Arts Honors Diploma; Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma (See next page for details)

Seal of Biliteracy (Obio) Must show proficiency in English and another language. One of the options for showing proficiency in English is earning a score of proficient or higher on the ELA II EOC, as well as a foreign language competency exam.

Technology Seal (Ohio) A student can earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program.

Community Service Seal (Local) Student must have 12 hours of documented community service during 9th-12th grade and show signed approval from the organization.

Fine and Performing Arts Seal (Local) Successful completion of 2 semesters of a fine or performing art course within 9th-12th grade (successful completion means a C or higher both semesters); documentation comes from course grade being on transcript.

Student Engagement Seal (Local) Throughout the 9th-12th grade, students must successfully participate in 2 seasons of a sport(s), 2 seasons of marching band, 2 years of show choir and/or jazz band, or 2 semesters of participation in a school approved organization(s) or club(s) and both organization advisors and/or coaches must sign approval form.

The courses selected will determine the master schedule of classes for the next year. **Registration in a course requires a commitment on your part to that course.** You have freedom of choice regarding the classes you and your parents select for the coming school year.

Changes will be considered for the following reasons only: <u>LACK OF REQUIRED COURSE:</u> If you are missing a course that is a graduation requirement OR you failed a mandatory course and need to repeat the course. <u>FAILURE TO MEET PREREQUISITES</u>: If you registered for a course, but failed to meet the prerequisites mandatory for that course. <u>PROCEDURAL ERRORS</u>: A course code incorrectly inputted. <u>SUMMER</u>: Students who complete a course for credit recovery or CCP in summer school for which they are scheduled will be permitted to substitute another class for that course only. <u>CCP:</u> Registered for an equivalent CCP course.

Sophomore Scheduling Reminders:

- Every effort will be made to ensure that students are properly placed in the classes that they request during the
 registration process. However, if there are conflicts in class periods priority will go to core courses and courses
 required for graduation.
- Students and parents must give serious consideration now when selecting courses. Schedules are not changed unless one of the following criterion have occurred:
 - Lack of a required course
 - Failure to meet a prerequisite
 - Course completed in summer
 - Procedural error
 - Registering for an equivalent CCP course
- All students need to be aware of their graduation requirements including 20 credits and testing requirements.
- Students can only have one yearlong study hall.
- All students must be passing the equivalent of five courses for eligibility and full-time student status. (PE does not count towards eligibility)
- If students plan to enroll in CCP or BDA courses all paperwork and approval must be completed by the student and
 parent on or before necessary deadlines. Please list these intentions below in the "Notes to Counselor" box below.
