Foundational: Proficient scores on WebXams, A 12pt. Industry Credential, a pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program.
Supporting: Work-based learning. Earn the required score on WorkKeys Exam, or the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal

OR

Option 2: Enlist in the Military
 Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation

OR

Option 3: Complete College Coursework
 Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through CCP.

OR

Option 4: ACT or SAT
 Earn **remediation-free score** in the math or English subject areas on the ACT or SAT. To demonstrate competency in ELA II, a student must be remediation-free in subjects of English and Reading on the ACT or SAT.

Seal Requirements:

- The Ohio Department of Education requires all graduates in the Class of 2023 and Beyond earn a minimum of two diploma seals for graduation. One seal MUST be a state (Ohio) seal. Please see a brief description below of each.

OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal (Ohio) Must demonstrate certain professional skills required for success in the workplace. Students work with at least three experienced and trusted mentors who validate the demonstration of these skills in school, work, or the community.

Industry-Recognized Credential Seal (Ohio) Earn an approved industry-recognized credential or group of credentials totaling 12 points in a single career field.

College-Ready Seal (Ohio) Earn remediation-free ACT scores; currently these are English 18 or higher, Reading 22 or higher, and Mathematics 22 or higher- these values are subject to change

Military Enlistment Seal (Ohio) Provide evidence that a student has enlisted in a branch of the U.S. Armed Forces; or participate in an approved JROTC program

Citizenship Seal (Ohio) Earn a score of proficient or higher on both the American History and American Government end-of-course exams; earn a final course grade of B or higher in both high school American History and American Government courses.

Science Seal (Ohio) Earn the Science Seal is by earning a score of proficient or higher on the biology end-of-course examination; earn a final course grade of B or higher in an advanced science course

Honors Diploma Seal (Ohio) Students can earn one of the following: Academic Honors Diploma; International Baccalaureate Honors Diploma; Career-Tech Honors Diploma; STEM Honors Diploma; Arts Honors Diploma; Social Science and Civic Engagement Honors Diploma (See next page for details)

Seal of Bilingualty (Ohio) Must show proficiency in English and another language. One of the options for showing proficiency in English is earning a score of proficient or higher on the ELA II EOC, as well as a foreign language competency exam.

Technology Seal (Ohio) A student can earn a final course grade that is equivalent to a "B" or higher in an appropriate class taken through the College Credit Plus program.

Community Service Seal (Local) Student must have 12 hours of documented community service during 9th-12th grade and show signed approval from the organization.

Fine and Performing Arts Seal (Local) Successful completion of 2 semesters of a fine or performing art course within 9th-12th grade (successful completion means a C or higher both semesters); documentation comes from course grade being on transcript.

Student Engagement Seal (Local) Throughout the 9th-12th grade, students must successfully participate in 2 seasons of a sport(s), 2 seasons of marching band, 2 years of show choir and/or jazz band, or 2 semesters of participation in a school approved organization(s) or club(s) and both organization advisors and/or coaches must sign approval form.

ADMISSIONS REQUIREMENTS:

All applicants must meet the following general admission requirements:

Unconditional Admittance:

A minimum of eight (8) total credits in academic courses required by the State of Ohio for a high school diploma (commonly known as the Ohio Core), consisting of: Two (2) English credits, two (2) Math credits, one (1) Science credit, one (1) Social Studies credit, and two (2) additional state required courses.

Summer school credits earned after the end of the tenth grade count towards admittance, as long as the local school records the credit on the student transcript no later than one week before the opening of the Apollo high school year.

COLLEGE CREDIT: Students may want to take advantage of CCP classes and attend Apollo Career Center for a program. Students can obtain cost-free college credit through articulation agreements with many colleges, and Technical Credit Transfers are also available through Apollo programs. This gives students a head start if they choose to go on to college after graduation. Students can decide what is best for them, whether it is going right to work or continuing their education after high school graduation.

CREDENTIALS & CERTIFICATIONS: In addition to receiving college credit for Apollo programs, certifications and credentials can be earned. The industry recognized credentials vary by program. Some industry credentials can be earned in a first year of a program and in a second year of a program. For more information, please visit www.apollocareercenter.com.

ADMISSION STANDARDS: Students need: 2 credits English, 2 credits math, 1 credit science, 1 credit social studies and two additional state required courses for graduation.

COUNSELOR RECOMMENDED PROGRAMS

Career Explorations – Sophomores only (4 Credits-minimum)

The courses selected will determine the master schedule of classes for the next year. **Registration in a course requires a commitment on your part to that course.** You have freedom of choice regarding the classes you and your parents select for the coming school year.

Changes will be considered for the following reasons only:

LACK OF REQUIRED COURSE: If you are missing a course that is a graduation requirement OR you failed a mandatory course and need to repeat the course.

FAILURE TO MEET PREREQUISITES: If you registered for a course, but failed to meet the prerequisites mandatory for that course.

PROCEDURAL ERRORS: A course code incorrectly inputted.

SUMMER: Students who complete a course for credit recovery or CCP in summer school for which they are scheduled will be permitted to substitute another class for that course only.

CCP: Registered for an equivalent CCP course.



Course Change Policy



College Credit Plus

This program permits any qualified students, grades 7 through 12, to enroll in college on a full or part time basis for nonsectarian courses for which they may receive high school and/or college credit. College Credit Plus courses can be taken in the summer or either semester with a maximum of 30 semester hours per year. Complete information regarding this program will be available to parents via a virtual presentation.

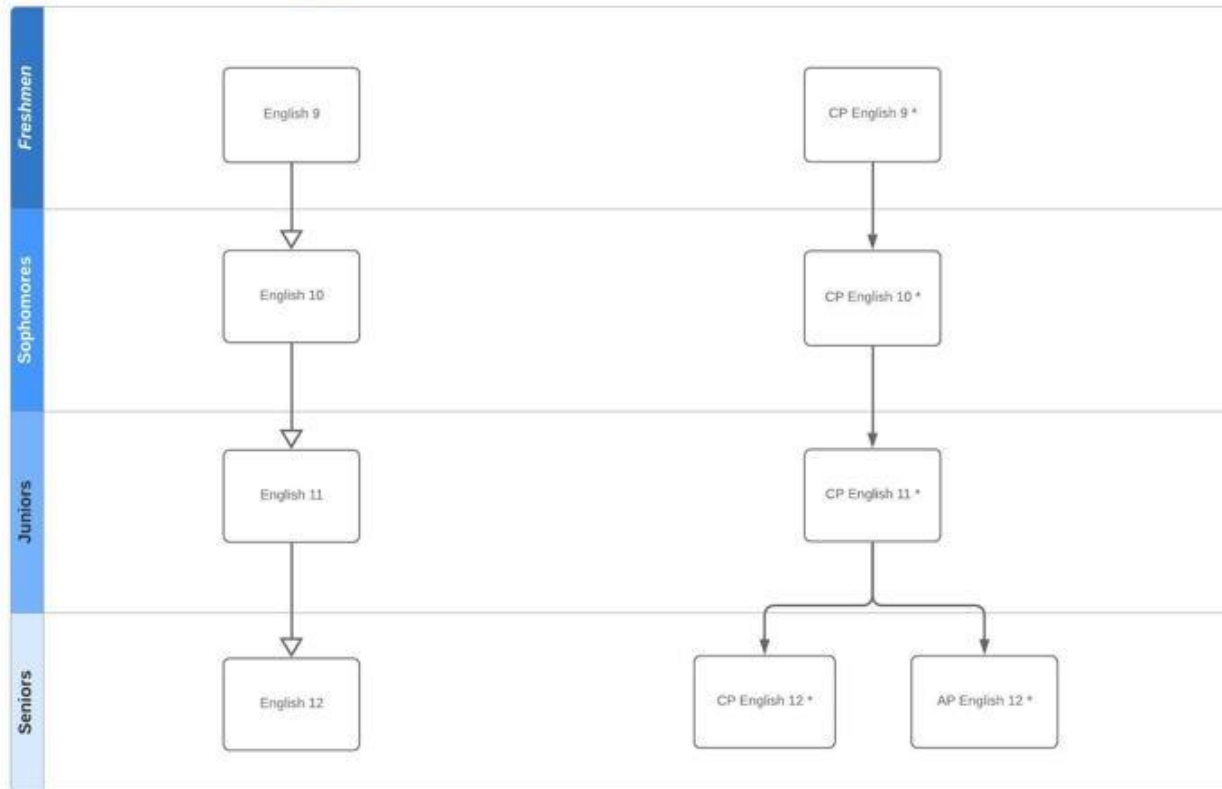

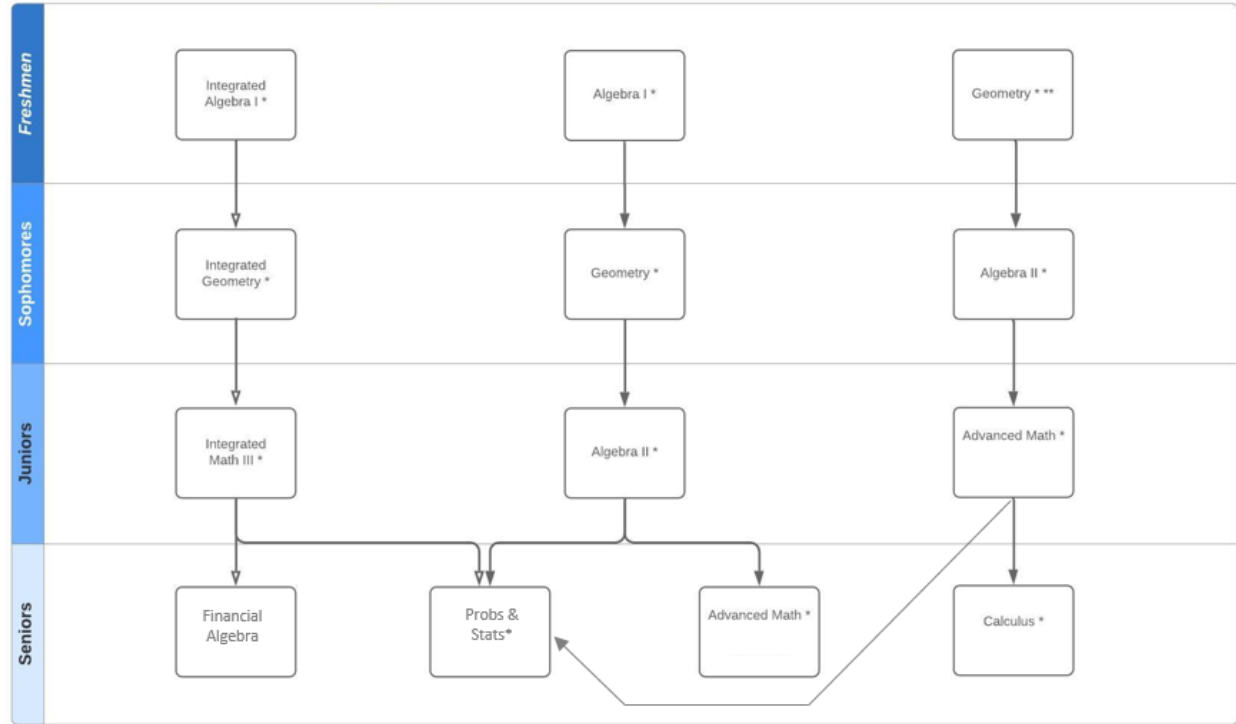




Math Department

Math

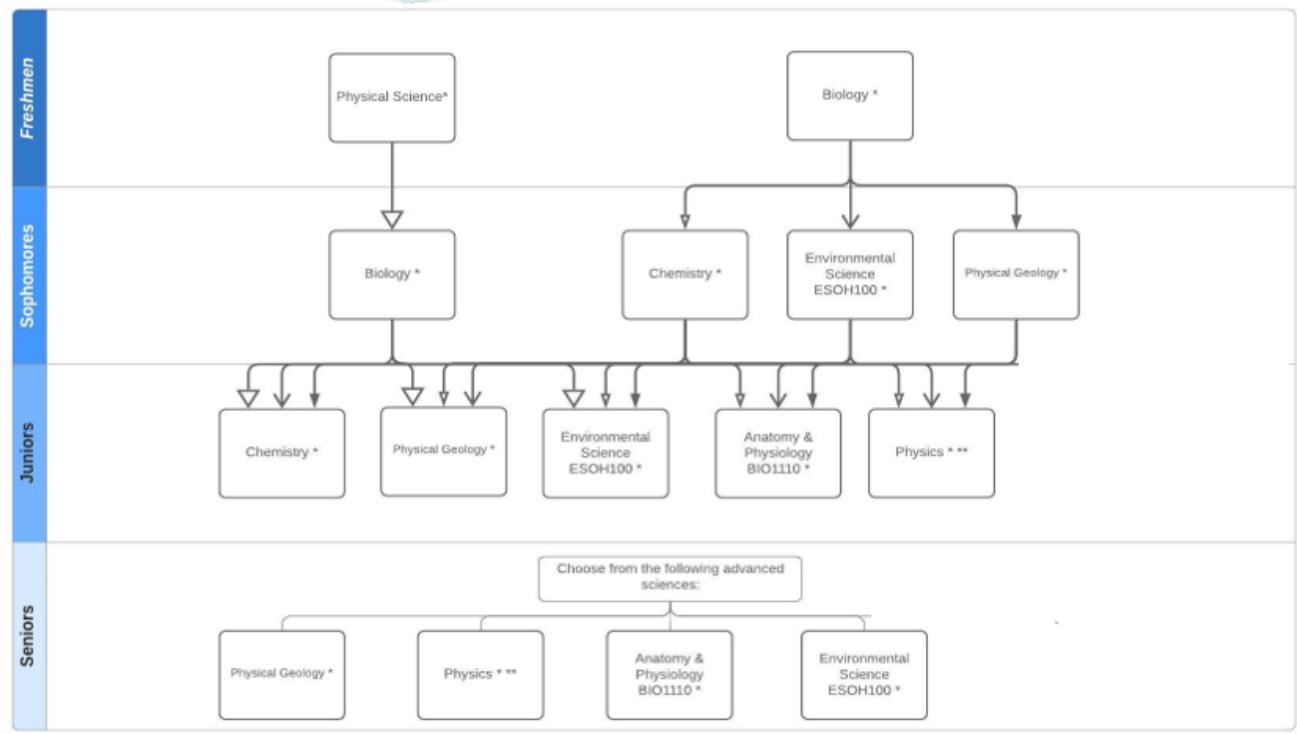

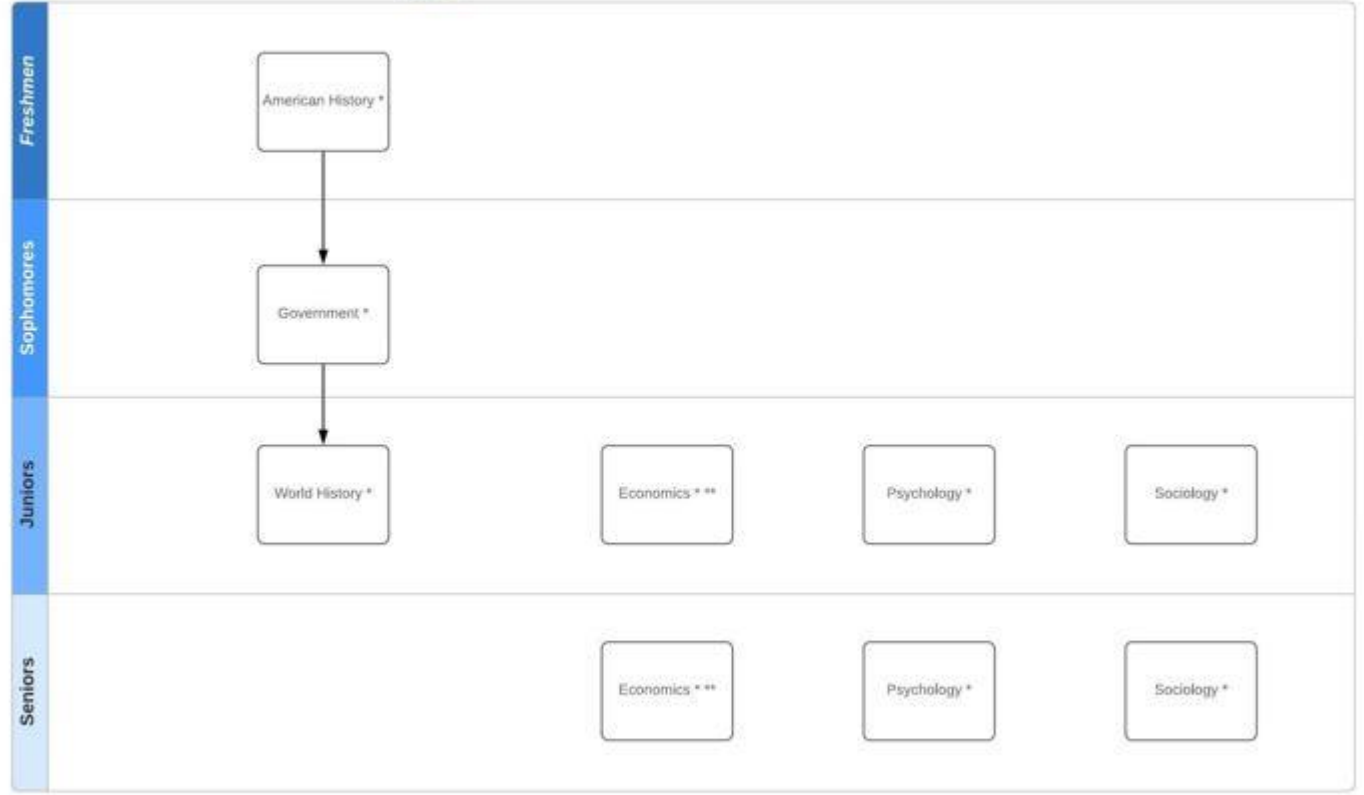
