The Community

Milan is a village located just south of the Ohio Turnpike, along the north coast of Lake Erie, and is the birthplace of Thomas Alva Edison, America’s greatest inventor. Located 20 miles south of Cedar Point, other nearby attractions include Kalahari Resorts, Great Wolf Lodge, and the Lake Erie Islands. Notoriety of the community is central to the Edison Birthplace Museum which includes a seven-building complex. The tree-lined streets of the village highlight historically restored homes. The downtown square offers a gazebo, antiques, various shops and eateries to browse and enjoy. Milan recently received national recognition through the placement of a statue of Thomas Alva Edison in the National Statuary Hall Collection at the U.S. Capitol. Milan has a population of 1,371 people and the communities of Berlin Heights and Milan are a classic example of lifestyles found in rural and small-town America.

Berlin Heights is located on State Route 61 between Norwalk and Vermilion. Local attractions include family style restaurants, garden and landscape nurseries, family

The District and School

Edison Local Schools is a district located in north central Ohio in Erie and Huron Counties serving the municipalities of Berlin Heights and Milan, including parts of Berlin, Florence, Huron, Milan, Norwalk, Oxford, Perkins and Vermilion townships. The district serves approximately 1,500 students in grades PK through 12 in one elementary school (K-3), one middle school (4-8), and one high school (9-12). The high school teams are the “Edison Chargers.”

Traditionally Edison students have been recognized for advanced academic, artistic and musical scholarship with graduates attending some of the finest higher educational institutions in the nation. Edison High School offers college courses from Kenyon College, Bowling Green State University, and Findlay University. Likewise, our teaching professionals have been recognized by numerous organizations for exemplary educational service.

Mission

The overall mission of the district is to provide our students a progressive course of study which contributes and collectively develops a mastery of their intellectual, moral, social, physical and aesthetic growth. The Faculty

Edison High School has 27 certified faculty members, giving the school a 13:1 student/faculty ration. 74% of the faculty hold an advanced degree.

Graduation Requirements

To graduate from Edison High School, a student must meet all requirements established by both the Edison Local Schools Board of Education and the State of Ohio Department of Education. The 21 minimum credits required for graduation are as follows:

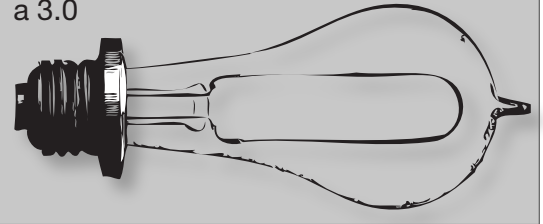
Grading Scale

All courses will use the four-point scale, determined as follows:

- A+ = 4.33
- A = 4.00
- A- = 3.67
- B+ = 3.33
- B = 3.00
- B- = 2.67
- C+ = 2.33
- C = 2.00
- C- = 1.67
- D+ = 1.33
- D = 1.00
- D- = 0.67

Honors, advanced placement and specific CCP courses will be awarded add-on points. These points will be added on to a student's cumulative grade point average after it has been calculated on the current grading scale. The add-on points will be .025 for a full year class and .0125 for a semester class. GPA and class ranking standards are computed each semester.
