## Agenda:

- Attendance Discussion
  - Extended Day <u>Proposal</u>: (Winsley/Cheek)
    - 1st week of April
    - Lisa has updated the 1A and 2A absences on the google doc for make up time.
    - They are allowed 5 absences
    - Beckwith: Start time 3:35, but officially start the timer at 3:45?
    - Dillion: Gives wiggle room to get in and get signed in.
    - Crooks: Only 10 days when some need to make up much more.
    - Homiller: Can't believe that they can make up that many.
    - Winsely: In conjunction with USA testprep.
    - Crooks: how about 8 days and no make up days?
    - Beckwith: Are we capping numbers, overflow room?
    - Winsley: 20-25 is the cap. There will be a hard cut off.
    - Dillion: Will there be an administrator available for things if they arise?
    - Crooks: They can just leave if they don't want to follow the rules.

      Make Up time is a privilege.
    - Higgs: Sodexo provides free snacks. We just need to know how many kids and what days.

# Tardies:

- Crooks: Amount of tardies went down and then went up a little (probably due to the weather).
- Crooks: How do we as a professional community address it?
  - Nulty-Brown: Her class stays after school

- Dillion: Let tardies be "this is the rule"
- Beckwith: Tardy Sweep-->straight down to where ever. Make it more instant.
- Crooks: Different rules? Manpower? People need to write them up and put in the tardies. We need to shore up our practices.
- Winsley: Tardy Sweep consequence would be not being allowed to go to class. That is the consequence. What to do about over tardies?
- Jessup: Keep writing it up, it will get to OSS
- Beckwith: What about the ones that are tardy to every class?
- Dillion: Purpose is to show that tardies are a problem.
- Stanich: How was the issue addressed (the idea that people are not following through with policy)
- Crooks: They are being addressed 1 on 1.
- Allen: Other periods need tardy sweeps.
- Homiller: Start right when the bell rings.

#### MTSS:

- Winsley: Purpose is to provide a multi-tiered level of support based on the learning level of a skill. Use universal screeners to see where students are.
- Crooks: For all students, not just EC referrals. Thinking about the whole child.
- Crooks: Intervention Blocks. We saw these are both schools shared with us as models of MTSS in secondary level. Could possibly put it in place next year?
  - Smart lunch: chaos
  - Easier: 30-40 mins between 1st and 2nd, every day.
  - 10 mins off each block.
  - Teachers on planning would hold a small intervention group or hold their club/advisory that period.
  - Friday: Homeroom days: class meetings or advisements.
     Social/emotional lessons, PBIS needs. Run school-wide clubs those days.
  - Cagle: beneficial for EC and ESOL
  - Crooks: attendance using a special app.
  - Walker-Smith: We had to do this by the state?
  - Crooks: This is the model that the model high schools that are moving forward with MTSS use.
  - Homiller: Can we address the block schedule?

- Faircloth: We can use this to build school culture. But we must be intentional about this and how we use this time. If you are going to run a club, run a club.
- Fleming: Is there a resource that we can take to our department?
- Crooks: Mt. Pleasant HS, Central Cabarrus HS, Clayton HS, N. Buncombe HS.
- Crooks: We will get something to you.
- NC StarCIP Focus: Consider additional action steps:
  - B.3.03: The principal monitors curriculum and classroom instruction regularly and provides timely, clear, constructive feedback to teachers.
    - Admin analyzes walkthrough data for trends (by May, Crooks).
  - A.4.06: All teachers are attentive to students' emotional states, guide students in managing their emotions, and arrange for supports and interventions when necessary.
- Other Indicators: At least one action step.
- 2019-2020 SLT members
  - Currently, we have 1 person per department. State policy requires each department be represented and the person must be voted in.
  - Do we need to have a new election? Does anyone want to step down? Open the election? We need to stagger departments.
  - Do we want (completely optional) to combine departments for SLT representation? For example, Math and Science department combine and vote for 1 person to represent them both. We have done that with Cultural Arts and World Languages. Talk as departments. OPTIONAL!!!!
  - For April Meeting: we need to decide which departments will vote this year and which will vote next year.
  - For May Meeting: 2018-2019 SLT members and new 2019-2020 SLT members attend May meeting. We'll vote on new chair.
  - We will open for a new chair. We need to vote before summer.
