

Learning Model

November 30, 2020 through December 18, 2020

Due to the spike locally in COVID-19 cases, and in attempting to reduce the numbers needing quarantined we will be moving back to our Hybrid learning model November 30, 2020 through December 18, 2020. The main reasons for this decision is staffing issues and returning to 6 feet distancing in most cases. Through our work with health departments in both Sandusky and Erie County we feel it necessary to return to Hybrid for the three weeks prior to winter break.

- Last name A-K on Tuesdays and Thursdays Remote Learning M,W,F
- Last Name L-Z on Wednesdays and Fridays Remote Learning M,T,R Mondays will continue to be used for students to come in with social/emotional support, and students having academic or attendance issues, or gifted services.

*If your child was Hybrid on days different than above to start the year - stay with those days.

We will make a decision on the remaining three weeks in the semester in January on December 11, 2020. This will be the end of the second week after Thanksgiving Break and will allow us the ability to look at data, talk to other area school districts & health officials about January expectations.

We are committed to return to full-in traditional learning as soon as we feel staffing is not an issue and our data indicates we can function in full traditional learning. We need your help in making sure masks are being worn, distancing is occurring, hand washing and disinfecting is occurring, and touch points are being cleaned and disinfected. As we team to accomplish this through the holiday seasons it can set us up for a great situation for education through the second semester.
