

Research Opposing Viewpoints Article



Hopefully, you have a topic for your research,
with a specific focus.

***Click on Gale Databases

Select Opposing Viewpoints (on the right)

Click on the Advanced Search (in gray bar, to the right of the search window)

Under *More Options*, click in the small box to limit your search to Full-Text Documents (it will put in a check mark)

You are now ready to **enter search terms**

use **quotes** around two words or more to make it a search phrase “love reading”

Push enter on the keyboard or click on the blue search box (bottom right)

Look at the magazines, news and/or academic journals (Links on right side)

If you need to narrow the search – on the second line of the advanced search, keep the **AND** to enter another word to search – example: school

You can click on **Add a row** (if needed)

The default is to search **Keyword** in the document (this is very helpful, keep it)

If you see a triangle, if you click on it, you have choices (AND, OR, NOT)

Look at the number of results from your search – you may need to narrow the search with additional words and phrases or broaden the search with fewer search words

GOAL: Find a useful article and Print it

Click on Gale Databases

Select Opposing Viewpoints (on the right)

Click on Browse Issues (in black bar under Opposing Viewpoints in Context)

This is a large subject list of possible topics

Select a topic that might be of interest

Click on links on the right side – Magazines, News, Academic Journals
