



Research - ProQuest

ProQuest contains national and international newspapers, including some PA newspapers, magazines, and scholarly journals.

This is what you do:

At Red Land High School -

Log-on to the computer, use Google Chrome, open a new window (+ sign at the top, like a tab)

Type go\ (This will show you the High School Portal, other helpful links too)

Select Red Land Library on the left side under Sites

This menu will look exactly like what you see on the library computers

At Home –

Go to the RLHS, pick Red Land Library (on the left)

Home Access (left side) Use passwords, your teacher may have put these in their Schoology class link

Print copies available in the library

***Click on ProQuest

Be sure you are on the Advanced Search screen – if not, click on **Advanced Search** (in gray bar under the green ProQuest heading)

Click on the small box to limit your search to **Full text** documents

Scroll down to the Source type: check **magazines** and **newspapers**

Return to the top of the page – you are now ready to **enter search terms**

use **quotes** around two words or more to make it a search phrase “drug addiction”

keep the **AND** to enter another word to search – example: treatment

You can click on **Add a row** (if needed)

The default is to search **Anywhere** in the document (this is very helpful, keep it)

If you see a triangle, if you click on it, you have choices (AND, OR, NOT)

Look at the number of results from your search – you may need to narrow the search with additional words and phrases

Results may be sorted by Most Recent First – You can change to Relevance

Since you already put in additional limits, changes (more words, different phrases can be added to the horizontal search)

Remember – Good information Fast! Quality vs. Quantity
