Parent Information on Inter-district Open Enrollment

Students living outside of Steubenville City School District Requesting to Attend Steubenville City Schools

Revised: 4/2024

The Steubenville Board of Education believes that students should, under certain prescribed circumstances, benefit from an interdistrict open enrollment policy. Guidelines for the transfer of students, based upon criteria with recommendations from officials of the Ohio Department of Education are listed below.

- 1. Applications for interdistrict transfer must be submitted to the Superintendent's office of The Steubenville City School District, 611 North 4th Street, Steubenville, OH 43952 by June 1st. Parents will be notified of acceptance/rejection no later than August 1st.
- 2. Interdistrict transfers are open to students from any school district in the state of Ohio.
- 3. Interdistrict enrollment limits set by The Steubenville City Schools shall be:
 - A. Twenty-four (24) students maximum for grades PreK through 4 classrooms.
 - B. Twenty-nine (29) students for grades 5-12 classrooms. The only exception to the aforementioned class sizes would be special education, accelerated classes, College Credit Plus or where a physical classroom limitation and State regulations may exist.
 - C. Class size for special education is determined by the State Board of Education Rule. Waiver of class size will not be granted by the Ohio Department of Education in order to accommodate open enrollment students.
 - D. The home district remains responsible for insuring the due process procedures are provided for their students. Decisions about the student's educational program remains with the home district.
- 4. The Board shall select students for assignment through following a priority list:
 - Priority One Non resident students attending the Steubenville City Schools who were previously enrolled in the District.
 - Priority Two Non resident students who have not previously attended the Steubenville City Schools.
 - o Priority Three Tuition students outside the Steubenville City School District.
- 5. The administration will determine building assignment, without guarantee that the building assignment (elementary) will prevail in subsequent years.
- 6. Enrollment in a special program Eg: Gifted, Special Education, will dictate which building a student must attend, as units are placed in buildings according to space availability.
- 7. The Steubenville City Schools are not required to institute any special education programs to serve transfer students. If a student is evaluated for placement in a special education program, representatives of the district of residence must be invited to participate in the placement meeting.
- 8. All approved transfers are in effect for the current school year only and may be discontinued at the discretion of the administration in subsequent years.
- 9. Applicants will be considered on a first come, first serve, basis through the implementation of the priority list described in #4.
- 10. Applicants may be rejected if the racial balance of either the sending or receiving school district would be negatively impacted.
- 11. The Steubenville City School District will accept no responsibility for the transportation of students to other districts unless it is deemed practical by the administration.
- 12. The Steubenville City School District may deny enrollment to students who have been expelled or suspended for ten (10) or more consecutive days in the current term or the immediately preceding term, as well as students who are convicted felons and/or students having a history of school violence.
- 13. All OHSAA guidelines pertaining to athletic eligibility shall be enforced.
- 14. The Superintendent may, by mutual agreement, waive the stated enrollment deadline.
- 15. The Superintendent of the student's residential District will be notified of the acceptance of the student's application within two (2) weeks of acceptance.
- 16. Status could be revoked if attendance/behavior guidelines are violated.
- 17. All native students wishing to enroll in the District will be enrolled and not be displaced due to open enrollment.
