# What is PBIS? - Review

#### **Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports**

- "PBIS is an evidence-based, tiered framework for supporting students' behavioral, academic, social, emotional, and mental health." (pbis.org)
- TMHS-specific program designed to:
  - Promote positive behaviors from students
  - Reduce negative behaviors from students
    - Provide interventions to students who struggle with behaviors
  - o Build **positive relationships** between students, families, and staff



#### Multiple reasons to build and refine PBIS program

- Making positive relationships between students, families, and staff an intentional part of classroom and building culture
- Part of TMCS Instructional Framework (Equity and Engagement)
  - Expectations included on TMCS website under **Student Services**
- PBIS expectations included in Ohio HB 318
  - Supporting Alternatives for Fair Education (SAFE) Act



### TIER 1: Universal, Primary Prevention (ALL students)



- Systems, data, and practices designed to promote positive behaviors in the vast majority (80% or more) of our students
  - Clear expectations for all students and staff (RAMS Expectations)
    - Explicitly teaching expectations to all students (**Teaching scripts**)
  - Acknowledging expected behaviors (PBIS Rewards App)
  - Consistent use of behavioral data to inform decisions (PBIS Team)
- Tier 1 interventions are all about BUILDING RELATIONSHIPS



### TIER 2: Targeted, Secondary Prevention (SOME students)



- Additional layers of systems, data, and practices designed to target specific students (10-15%) who are not meeting expectations
  - Additional instruction and practice for behavioral, social, emotional, and/or academic skills (Social Skills Group)
  - Increasing adult support and supervision (Check-In/Check Out)
  - Increasing academic supports and/or parent communication
- Students identified based on specific behavioral data



### TIER 3: Intensive, Individualized Prevention (FEW students)



- Small number of students (1-5%) receive most intensive and individualized supports, regardless of special education status.
  - Functional Behavior Assessments
  - Behavior Intervention Plan
  - Behavioral and/or mental health services
- Students identified based on specific behavioral data.



#### Inconsistent implementation, but headed in the right direction

- Inconsistency due to several factors
  - Frequent staff and administrative turn over
  - Lack of staff buy in and/or inconsistent staff implementation
- Positive steps taken last year and over the summer
  - Development of PBIS matrix and Behavior Management Flowchart
  - Moderate usage of PBIS Rewards points for positive behaviors
  - "Fun Day" and Kings Island trip as bigger PBIS rewards



• Goal 1: Consistent implementation of PBIS Tier 1 program by all staff

#### • Indicators:

- PBIS Matrix, teaching scripts, and posters will be provided to help establish and reinforce positive expectations for students
  - Staff will reteach expectations on a quarterly basis
- PBIS Rewards app utilized for every day positive recognition, with all teachers awarding at least 20 PBIS Rewards points per week
  - Larger, quarterly rewards planned by PBIS team



- Goal 1: Consistent implementation of PBIS Tier 1 program by all staff
- Action Steps:
  - Mr. Mickey will provide teaching materials and documentation forms to ensure all staff are equipped to teach PBIS Matrix **before 8/14**
    - Teaching completed by Tuesday, 8/22 (repeated quarterly)
  - Mrs. Schleich (McVaugh) will provide PBIS Rewards PD focusing on how to use the system and practical strategies for implementation
    - PD will be completed by Friday, 9/1
    - Monitoring of PBIS Rewards usage will begin Monday, 9/4



 Goal 2: Begin development of PBIS Tier 2 team to provide additional supports for our Tier 2 students.

#### • Indicators:

- Public School Works referrals are submitted following a consistent structure to provide reliable behavioral data
- PBIS team will utilize **district resources** to assist in development of Tier 2 team and intervention strategies
- PBIS team will explore available PD offerings to assist in development of Tier 2 team and intervention strategies



 Goal 2: Begin development of PBIS Tier 2 team to provide additional supports for our Tier 2 students.

#### Action Steps:

- Mr. Mickey will provide Public School Works PD and usage guidelines
  - PD will be completed by Thursday, 8/10
- PBIS Team will meet with Middle School PBIS team and Student Services Coordinator to obtain guidance and explore PD offerings.
  - Meetings will take place prior to 9/29 with further action steps to be decided at that time
