On the academic side, 17% of our students receive special education services.

Construction on the Innovation and Aquaponics Center is progressing toward an anticipated completion by the end of April, 2022. The facility will feature two large labs, an audio/visual center, a workroom, student lounge, an aqua/hydroponics greenhouse, and outdoor classroom Students planning to take an AP Exam in May setting.

The day has been designated an Inservice Day in order that our staff can receive additional professional development training with enhancing academic and behavioral interventions for students and crisis intervention.
