On the academic front, our staff will continue to receive professional development opportunities during this school year in order to increase their abilities and improve their skill set to provide instruction and engage student acquisition with respect to the state academic content standards. As the new school year begins, please remember The district will also continue to provide training for staff with respect to the use of AI in instructional practices and student use, and multi-tiered systems of academic and behavioral support.

Prior to the start of the school, a few projects have or will be completed with respect to our building and grounds. The most visible project is the annual repairs and sealing of our asphalt parking lots, drives, and playground. In addition, a new asphalt parking lot has been completed for the Wellness Center along with an asphalt surface for the baseball/softball spectator seating area. Interior projects completed include replacement of carpet in several A-Wing classrooms, and elementary/middle school office spaces. Our library and main gymnasium received a new coat of paint and both gymnasium floors received their annual sanding and rewaxing. Another major project that will be completed in late August is the re-alignment of the track markings that will move the start and finish line to the home side of the track for spectator viewing. Lastly, new stage curtains will be installed in August.

> Elementary students may wear shorts in August, September and May, with the opportunity for an earlier date based on the discretion of the Principal.

We also want to highlight and re-inform everyone of our Attendance Policy brought on by House Bill 410 that deals with "Habitual Truancy" in schools.

\* Students are allowed SEVEN excused absences per year. Students will be required to have a doctor's note/excuse every absence past the seven day excused limit. Without a doctor's note, the absence will be deemed unexcused. Beyond the seven days, the doctor's note must be received within three days of the absence. The principal has discretion to determine the absence excused or unex-

- Students sent home during the school day due to illness will be excused regardless of the number of prior missed days.
- If the illness requires an additional day out of school due to fever, vomiting, etc., the next day will be considered an excused absence as well and will NOT require a doctor's note.

We want to emphasize the importance of communication of absences to the school to help in cleaning up unexcused absences. We also would like to encourage long vacations to be scheduled during non-school days. We certainly appreciate your understanding of the importance fro our students to be at school. We understand the difficulty of this at times, but we want to make this a TEAM effort from our staff here at Antwerp Elementary and to you, as Parents/ Guardians. Thank you for your understanding.
