


Success

This past month, students have been learning about communication skills, social skills, and assertiveness in their Life Skills lessons. 7th-grade girls participated in an event called "Girls with Goggles". Each student got a cinch bag with a t-shirt, goggles, candy, and various other items that were donated by the event sponsors. The girls took a virtual tour of the programs offered at the Ashland Co West Holmes Career Center.







World Studies

Students finished their Greece Unit by exploring the various greek legacies. Also, students developed an online portfolio to share with their parents showcasing their work, standards they mastered, and a SMART goal for the next nine weeks. They are currently working on incorporating STEM in social studies by designing and building a chariot or catapult.

Mythology

Students finished the novel "The Lightning Thief". They ended the course by watching the film that goes along with the book. Students identified similarities and differences and decided which version they liked better.







ELA 7

Students dressed up as greasers and socs as they finished the novel The Outsiders. Students voted for the best costumes in each class, and the seventh grade teachers even got in on the fun! This month, students will by analyzing some poetry and also working on some problem based learning. As we wrap up our "Generations" unit, students will plan a hypothetical gathering in which generations can learn from one another.





Science 7

In 7th Science we are learning about Ecosystems and Biomes: abiotic and biotic factors, energy flow in ecosystems, and cycles of matter such as the water cycle, the carbon cycle, the nitrogen cycle, biomes such as the six land, and the two water biomes. We have a technology update. We found a 3D app called Merge. Students can construct a paper cube that when used with their phones they can see many figures in 3D. There are apps for many school related subjects that can be viewed in 3D.

we have a new group of Muggles who are about to journey to Hogwarts. They began reading the book at the beginning of the second nine weeks, and coming up they will write journal entries and letters about the book. They will also create their own Diagon Alley advertisements!



Social Studies 6

We've wrapped up our first of two economics units. The 6th grade students were being producers, consumers, and entrepreneurs as we discussed topics of scarcity, needs vs. wants, and the three fundamental economic questions of what to produce, how to produce it, and whom to produce it for. Students had to come up with a product, service, or invention, and write about their answers to those fundamental economic questions and share an advertisement with the class.

ELA 6

6th grade ELA students just finished their first essay on the interesting life of Roald Dahl. We are continuing our "Childhood" unit by moving into our textbooks, where we will read non-fiction stories about the challenges and triumphs of childhood. We will also do our first socially-distanced group project this month!

Public Speaking

In 6th grade public speaking class we finished performing our final speeches, and we even went to the commons area and performed some impromptu speeches on the stage. Our 6th grade students have been doing a great job and are definitely becoming more comfortable speaking in front of their peers!
