## **Middle School Athletics**



## 8th Grade

## ELA8

As the new school year gets underway, 8th grade students have been studying the importance of having a growth mindset - the belief that intelligence can be developed through hard work, facing challenges head-on, using effective learning strategies, and getting help from others when needed. They have also learned how to set goals that get results. As a way of summarizing this unit, students are creating presentations about these topics and will share them with all middle school students through the morning announcements for encouragement throughout the year.

Students have also learned about the importance of being able to communicate clearly through email, especially when they need to contact a teacher to ask for help. They have been practicing this skill by writing emails to their 8th grade teachers.

This year we will study Greek and Latin prefixes and roots that make up many of the words in the English language. Learning the definitions of these word parts is a strategy to help the students figure out the meaning of words that are unknown to them.

## **Career Exploration 8**

Students began the nine weeks taking the first steps in career exploration by completing individual surveys to determine their work values, personality types, and interests. We will explore the 16 career clusters by using the Ohio Means Jobs website before students begin to match the information they have gathered about themselves with possible careers. Ask your student to see their Career Portfolio - I am proud of the work each of them have done so far!




## 7th Grade

### Success

### **World Studies**

Students practiced latitude and longitude and have reviewed basic social studies concepts. They have begun their first unit on Ancient Greece geography. Some students took a virtual field trip to the Acropolis of Athens, Greece.

### **Mythology**

Students are learning about Greek gods and goddesses. Students shared presentations and will begin the novel "The Lightning Thief".

## **ELA**

Students are reading the outsiders, the classic novel by S.E. Hinton. It's a great way to start examining character traits and text evidence; key skills that will be used all year. Students will also do a stereotype gallery walk and assess what matters most to them when meeting new people.




## **Specials**


