

## Wright State University CCP Steps and Deadlines

All students intending to earn college credit and are enrolled in a college credit plus class offered at Wright State University or on the Bellbrook High School campus **must complete all steps** outlined below in order to receive CCP credit. By applying, you confirm that you are enrolling in a college credit plus class for college credit. You acknowledge that you understand that this course, and the grade earned, will appear on both your high school transcript and college permanent records. If you fail the course, you will be held responsible for paying the cost of the class. You will be responsible for requesting an official transcript from the CCP college to be sent to your future college.

**Step 1**. Attend the CCP Parent Information Presentation. At the completion of the presentation you will be provided a code.

<u>Step 2:</u> Complete the <u>Intent to Participate Google Form</u> by **April 1st!** You will need the code provided in the CCP Parent Information Presentation. No late forms will be accepted.

<u>Step 3:</u> Apply online! Complete the application at <a href="https://www.wright.edu/college-credit-plus/enrollment-process">https://www.wright.edu/college-credit-plus/enrollment-process</a> and ask Mrs. Scohy to submit your transcripts. The college will notify you about acceptance with either an email or mailed letter. Application Deadline: May 1st.

**Step 4:** Complete the mature content <u>permission slip</u> and <u>student questionnaire</u>.

Step 5: Students must meet college requirements to enroll for credit. Each university sets their own requirements for admission. Students going into grades 10, 11, and 12 who have obtained an unweighted 3.0 or better cumulative GPA, will be admitted to Wright State without test scores. Students going into grades 7, 8, and 9 are required to submit ACT or SAT scores or complete the writing and math placement assessments. Any student who has below an unweighted 3.0 cumulative GPA, is required to submit ACT or SAT scores or complete the writing and math placement assessments.

- You will be responsible for scheduling a placement test at WSU. Visit

- Students with a learning disability, medical condition, sensory impairment, psychological condition (including ADD/ADHD) or have an IEP or 504 in high school, should contact the Office of Accessibility for help with completing placement testing by calling 937-775-5680.

**Step 6:** If taking classes at Wright State University, you must contact Wright State's University College at (937) 775-5750 regarding registration appointments to schedule an advising and registration appointment. https://www.wright.edu/student-success/academic-advising/exploratory-majors-and-college-credit-plus-advising

**Step 7:** Any students taking classes at Wright State University must meet with Mrs. Scohy to review your schedule before the 1st day of school. Email <a href="mailto:khris.scohy@bss.k12.oh.us">khris.scohy@bss.k12.oh.us</a> to schedule an appointment time.



**Step 8:** Register for your classes and get your books (if required).

**Step 9:** Complete the CCP early release/late entry paperwork and turn in to Mr. Whalen.

## All steps must be completed by the 1st day of school to be enrolled in the CCP course.
