Dear Dover Families:

Beginning Monday, January 25, all students in grades K-8 will return to school in A1: Face-to-Face Instruction. It has always been our goal to get our students back in school as close to normal as possible. We are looking forward to a return to the five days a week face-to-face instruction for our students at South, East, Dover Avenue, and Dover Middle School.

A return to daily face-to-face instruction is a priority for all students; however, there may be times we still face staff shortages this year. In this case, we plan to use Remote Learning only in those classrooms or grade levels, which will allow the rest of the students to attend school daily. We know this is not ideal and requires flexibility on the part of all; however, we want to be in session face-to-face for as many students as possible as often as possible. Principals, school nurses, and/or teachers will communicate directly with those students' families if this is necessary.

Due to the current number of positive cases and students quarantined at the high school, we will continue in A2: Modified Face-to-Face at Dover High School only until further notice. We simply need more time to transition DHS students back to five days a week.

We continue to appreciate your patience and positive outlook as we work through this school year together.
