Dear Dover Parents and Families:

Welcome back! We hope you had a wonderful holiday season with your family and loved ones.

As we continue to monitor the impact of the holiday season and Covid-19 in our schools and community, we will **resume classes in A2: Modified/Hybrid Learning from Monday, January 11 through Friday, January 22.** Because of the Teacher In-Service Day on Friday, January 15, and Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday on Monday, January 18, this period includes 8 school days.

Our **goal, at this time, is to return to A1: Face-to-Face Instruction for all students on Monday, January 25.** Recognizing that this situation is ever-changing, we feel that, unless there are significant changes between now and then, the change in the state quarantine guidance in classroom settings will, with some modifications to our procedures, allow us an opportunity to resume full in-person instruction at that time.

Many of you are aware that the state has issued new guidance regarding quarantines following an **in-class** exposure in K-12 schools. As long as students/teachers are all wearing masks and following health protocols in classrooms, students/teachers exposed to a Covid-positive person in a classroom setting are no longer required to quarantine. However, it is important to note that this order **only** applies to a supervised classroom setting when everyone is wearing masks, not to cafeterias, playgrounds, busses, etc. This change in quarantine order also does not apply to athletics and/or extracurricular activities.

We appreciate your continued support. Like all of you in your own homes, we look ahead to the new year with anticipation that 2021 will bring brighter days. We see the light and look ahead with optimism to all the new year will bring. We hope this is the beginning of a cautious and deliberate plan to return to those days for all of our students and families.
