How is Mapleton helping all students learn to read?

Mapleton Elementary now implements a Structured Literacy curriculum that supports the needs of all students, including those who have been identified as needing additional support in Language Arts. As referenced in Ohio's Dyslexia Guidebook, Structured Literacy is an instructional approach that encompasses the type of explicit and systematic reading instruction supported by research. Structured Literacy doesn't refer to a single instructional method or program.


