As we start the winter season, I want to urge all our spectators to follow the Section V motto, "Be Loud, Be Proud, Be Positive!"

Spectator Code of Behavior/Ethics: It is the responsibility of the spectator to:

4. Learn the rules of the game in order to be a better informed spectator.

6. Accept the call/judgment of coaches and officials.
7. Encourage other spectators to participate in the spirit of good sportsmanship.
8. Avoid the use, abuse, and resulting negative influence of drugs, including alcohol and tobacco/vaping.

National Honor Society

Congratulations to our new members of the National Honor Society! Thank you to Mr. D'Amuro for being our guest speaker and giving a wonderful speech!

There are four "pillars" of NHS, scholarship, service, character and leadership. To be eligible to apply for membership, students must have a cumulative high school average of 90.0% or better, which satisfies the scholarship pillar. The students fill out an application and need four letters of recommendation, two from former teachers so the faculty council can get an idea of what the potential inductee is like in school, and two letters from community members so the faculty council can get an idea of what the potential inductee is like outside of school. Once the potential inductees turn in the application and the letters, the faculty council of 5 members look over all of the information, discuss each candidate, and makes a final vote as to whether or not the student will be accepted for membership.





Four students in Mrs. Roman's high school class attend WeMoCo in the morning and for 2-3 afternoons per week they participate in a work study program in the community, as well.


These work studies are an integral part of their school curriculum to build upon their life, social, and job skills for life beyond Holley High School.
